Smoke Rings Spiral Into Huge Figures

Canadians are smoking more cigarettes than ever before, close to 17 billion in 1949, according to latest official figures.

A review of tobacco production statistics by the Canadian Division of the American Can Company, a major manufacturer of cigarette and tobacco cans, indicates that Canadian men and women actually puffed their way through the astronomical figure last year. The 1948 figure was 15,852,875,000 cig-

The use of smoking tobacco fell off somewhat last year from the 1948 peak. The respective totals were 27,754,961 pounds in 1949; 28,-183,908 pounds the previous year. But Canadians still blew smoke rings by the trillion!




