**THE NEW CARS**  
 With a few exceptions no major changes in style of next year's cars are expected by the Financial Post. None of the more popular makes—Ford, Plymouth, Dodge, Chev., Pontiac, Meteor, are expected to show much more than indentation changes.  
 How about prices? Until Ford announced recently it was holding the price line, there were signs that prices would be higher. Costs are still rising. However makers are expected to do their utmost to hold prices down.

**Two Theories Why Face Called "Mug"**

Why is the face called "the mug"? The face, according to the most generally accepted theory, came to be called the mug from the fact that in the eighteenth century drinking mugs were commonly made to represent grotesque human faces. Even at the present time mug survives in the sense of grimace. The term has been applied to cylindrical vessels with a handle since the sixteenth century and is of unknown origin in that sense.  
 Sheep belonging to a breed characterized by having the face completely covered with wool were also known as mugs. Some glossaries defined the term as a hornless sheep, and that may have been its origin.

**80 Percent Of All Fires Preventable**

A careful study of fire records shows that at least 80 per cent of fires are preventable. The following examples are given among the thousands of known causes to show how easy fires can start and the fatal results that may follow:  
 A man dropped his cigarette in a couch in the lobby of a hotel. Fire resulted at 3 a.m. and resulted in the death of four people.  
 A mother in one of the leading college cities, for the five hundredth time perhaps, started a fire with coal oil. The fire she started burned to death three children besides herself.  
 A man dropped a match on a garage floor, walked on and left it. A six year old child found it and ignited her clothing which resulted in burns that caused her death a few hours later.  
 A man attempted to sleep and smoke at the same time—result, he set the bed afire, was overcome with smoke, and removed in an unconscious state. Only the timely arrival of the fire department saved him from being cremated alive.
