The contribution of our Frenchspeaking population to Canada's economy and culture is also remarked as subject to considerable misconception.

Among British visitors the most common misconception would appear to be on the size and distances involved in Canada; among Americans about our position in the Commonweath and concerning our climate and industrial develop-

One respondent suggests that all this adds up to ignorance of Canada rather than misconception.
