### Guelph Presbytery Charges Separated

The Presbytery of Guelph of the Presbyterian church met in St. David's church, Campbellville, on Tuesday afternoon and evening, September 14, for their regular September meeting and to conduct the service of designation for Rev. J. E. Sutherland who leaves shortly to take up his duties as a missionary in Formosa.

Rev. C. D. Farrlis of St. Andrew's church, Galt, was elected moderator to succeed Rev. P. G. MacInnes of Elora. Two young men, Leslie Barclay and Malcolm Summers, were certified to Knox College and a third, Albert Cook, was received as a candidate for the Christian ministry.

M. M. Coles reported for the budget committee that \$2,395 more had been received for the missionary budget than at this date last year. Rev. P. G. MacInnes, reporting for the committee on Christian Education, outlined the activities in his department this fall. There is to be a leadership training conference for teen-age workers in Knox church, Guelph, next week. The Young People's Council are also arranging a leadership training conference for their officers. The church school worker's rally will be later in September in Kitchener.

**Separate Pastorates**  
It was decided to separate St. Paul's church, Guelph from Rockwood and Eden Mills after October 1 so St. Paul's can have both

morning and evening services. Rev. F. Williamson will continue to minister to the St. Paul's congregation.

The same evening, a large congregation assembled for the designation service. Rev. J. E. Sutherland was presented for designation by Rev. E. H. Johnson, the Overseas Secretary of the General Board of Missions. Mr. Johnson, himself, served in Manchuria before the war.
