Pennie, nine, Donna, eight, and Billy, three, lived in the house, which is owned by Murray Sprout, Mrs. Kirkman and their son, Billy, were in the house at the time but escaped uninjured.

Fire Chief A. E. Clements said that the alarm was turned in shortly after ten o'clock on Thursday morning. The Milton volunteer fire brigade rushed to the scene in time to save most of the furniture. The firemen brought the blaze under control in half an hour but the rear of the house was completely gutted, both upstairs and downstairs.

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—The big light in the old Cape Spear light-house will be transferred to the new light-house structure. The original Cape Spear light-house, 130 years old, will be turned over to the Historic Sites and Monuments Society of Canada.

Allow to rise until double in bulk. Bake in hot oven (400°F) 15-20 minutes. Yield: Fills 36 rolls.

CURRIED CHICKEN

1 cup butter or margarine
1 tablespoon crushed French's Onion Flakes
1/2 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon French's Pepper
2 teaspoons French's Curry Powder
1/2 teaspoon French's Worcestershire Sauce
2 cups chicken stock
1 cup milk
2 1/2 cups diced chicken

Melt butter or margarine, add onion and cook over low heat until soft. Stir in flour and seasonings. Add stock, cook until thick, stirring constantly. Add milk and chicken. Heat thoroughly. Serve with hot rice. Yield: 6 servings.

CAROL FRENCH'S PUMPKIN PIE

1 cup granulated sugar
2 to 3 teaspoons French's Pumpkin Pie Spice
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 eggs, beaten
1 tablespoon melted butter or margarine
1 cup sieved pumpkin
1 cup milk

Combine sugar, spice and salt with beaten eggs and melted butter. Blend carefully. Add pumpkin and milk. Mix thoroughly. Pour into unbaked pastry shell. Bake 15 minutes in hot oven (450°F) then reduce heat to slow (325°F) and bake about 40 minutes or until filling is firm. Yield: 1-9 inch pie.

CAROL FRENCH'S APPLE PIE

1 9 oz. pkg. French's Good Luck Pie Crust Mix
3/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon flour (optional)
1 1/4 teaspoons French's Apple Pie Sauce
4 cups sliced tart apples
2 tablespoons butter or margarine

Prepare pastry according to package directions. Roll out under crust and fit into a 9-inch pie pan. Chill. Mix sugar, salt, flour and spice. Spread half the mixture over the pastry-lined pan. Fill with peeled, thinly sliced apples and remainder of sugar mixture. Dot with butter or margarine. Roll and fit top crust. Turn up lower crust and flute edges together; this forms a wall to prevent juice from running out. Bake in a hot oven (450°F) 10 minutes, then in a moderate oven (350°F) 30 minutes.

CAROL FRENCH'S CHILI CON CARNE

1/4 cup margarine or salad oil
1 pound ground beef
1/2 cup chopped onion (or 2 tablespoons French's Onion Flakes)
1 tablespoon French's Sweet Pepper Flakes
2 teaspoons salt
1 tablespoon French's Chili Powder
1 tablespoon brown sugar
