Amend Act at Fire Inspection Course, Chief Clement Attends

Fire Chief A. E. Clement recently attended the Fire Inspection Practice course at the Fire Marshall's office in Toronto. Chief Clement was one of 66 attending the course, where fire chiefs and industrial plant firemen took lectures and practical exercises in fire inspections.

The group inspected factories and hotels, and paid a visit to the Underwriter's Laboratories of Canada, where investigations into fires are held. Also attending from Halton were Chief Reg Law, his brother Jack, and Frank Armstrong of Burlington. Alf Peacock of Nelson and Ben Whitmee of the Ford plant at Oakville.

Each man attending and passing the four-day course was awarded an Inspector's Certificate at the conclusion of the lectures.

An important amendment to the Fire Marshall's Act was passed by those attending the course. Dealing with the inspection of buildings for fire hazards, the amendment gives an inspector permission to order a re-inspection by the H. E.P.C. of electrical installations and wiring if he thinks that inadequacy or want of repair of such wiring might be a serious fire hazard. The cost of such an inspection by the Hydro would be born by the owner or occupant of the building.

Eelgrass Packing

YARMOUTH, N.S. (CP)—Two 14 foot speedboats were shipped to a United States exhibition by a new firm established here with American capital.

Along with the boats went something that until a few years ago was thought useless: eelgrass. It went along as padding to prevent damage to the boats in their crates.


The firm is the Acadian Boat-builder Ltd. at West Pubnico. Experiments in which supersonic sound will be used to determine the properties of wood are being planned.





Notes were given on food values of the different cereals and the home assignment was to begin record books and study the cereals that are necessary for good health.

A lovely lunch was served by the hostess and lunch committee, Anna Peacock and Carol McCarron. The next meeting will be held at the home of Vivian Fish.




