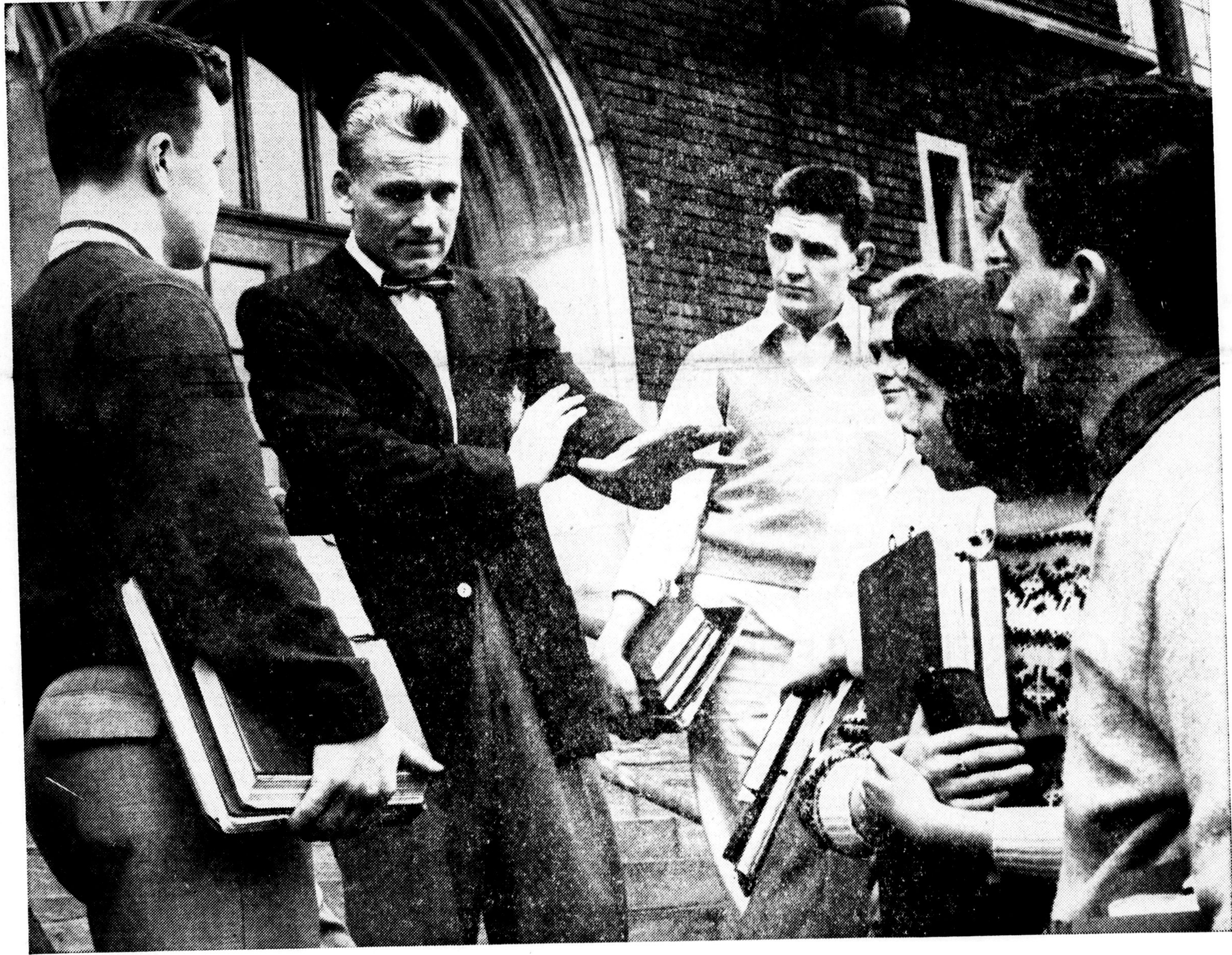
Candidate Raps Unemployment
