Use a folded piece of cloth or a cover over pussy's pillow which can be washed often. In the hot weather, a cat can sleep with comfort on a newspaper which can be changed often. Don't let pussy go night prowling—insist that she sleep in her own bed!.

Let Mommy Feed

A kitten can be fed from a medicine dropper the first week of life and can learn to lap milk the second week. However, it is best to have a kitten fed by the mother cat for the first two or three weeks and gradually encourage it to take from a saucer. Kittens have at least three or four meals a day. 


