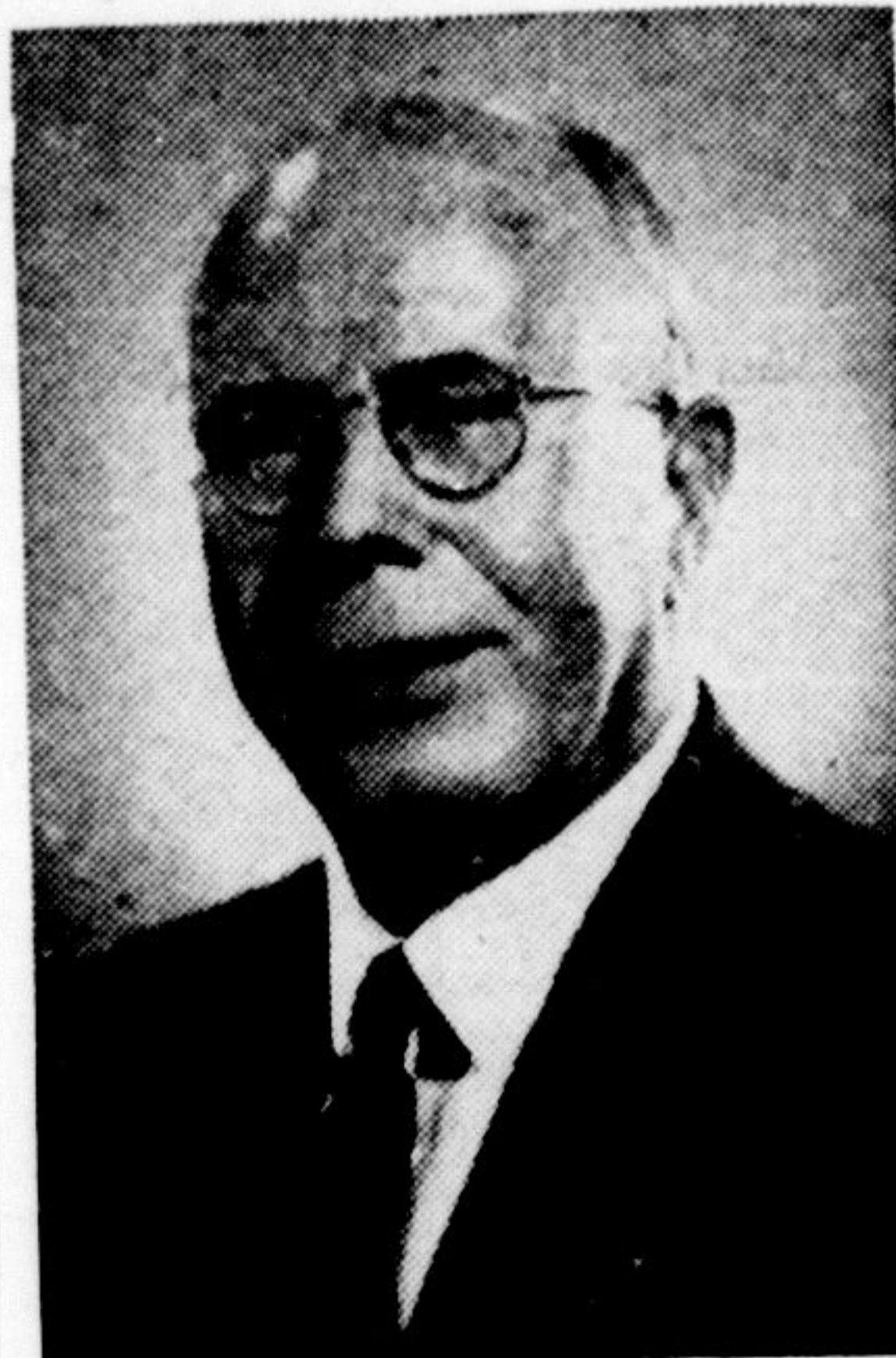

Names C. V. Charters, Brampton Ontario Hospital Commission

C. V. Charters of Brampton, well known figure in the printing and publishing industries and long associated with the hospital field, has been appointed by the Provincial Government as the seventh member of the Ontario Hospital Services Commission.

The new Commissioner is now Chairman of the Board of Chart-

ers Publishing Company Limited, having been its president from 1943 to 1958. Mr. Charters is the former publisher of Brampton's weekly newspaper the 'Conservator' and was Managing Director of the Canadian Weekly Newspapers Association from 1935 to 1946.

For 20 years, Mr. Charters was a member of the Board of the Peel Memorial Hospital and was the Board's president in 1955-56. He also has been a member of the Ontario Hospital Association's Board of Directors from 1951 and was president of that association in the year 1956-57. Other activities include membership in the Brampton Lions Club, of which he was past president, and in the Brampton Chamber of Commerce, of which he is a former secretary. Mr. Charters is an Anglican and a member of the executive committee of the Toronto Diocesan synod.
