Ontario Steel won in the second game by a decisive 13-0 tally over the winless Department of Highways.

The score ended in a 2-2 tie at the end of the first period in the first game. Gordy Bell and Hap Emms scored for Gerrys while Ronny Phillips and Tom Barrett counted markers for PLR. In the second period, Robertsons outscored their opponents 5-2, B. Sales firing three, Barrett one and Doug

McCutcheon one. Hap Emms with his second of an eventual three and Nipper Gervais with one, were the Gerry's marksmen.
