C. Bishop Escapes Death As Car Crushed by Train

ACTON—Cyril Bishop, 150 Wynford Place, narrowly missed certain death when the late model car he was driving was demolished by a C.N.R. train on No. 7 Highway. He leapt from the vehicle at the railway crossing at Pleasant, approximately five miles west of Brampton seconds before the shattering impact.

Travelling alone and proceeding west from his work at Malton, Mr. Bishop was approaching the crossing when the flasher lights began

to operate. As he applied the brakes, his car went into a spin and turned completely around stalling in the middle of the tracks.

With only seconds to spare, Mr. Bishop jumped from his stalled vehicle and was able to take only a few steps when the giant engine struck the car and carried it for several hundred feet down the tracks before it was tossed to one side.

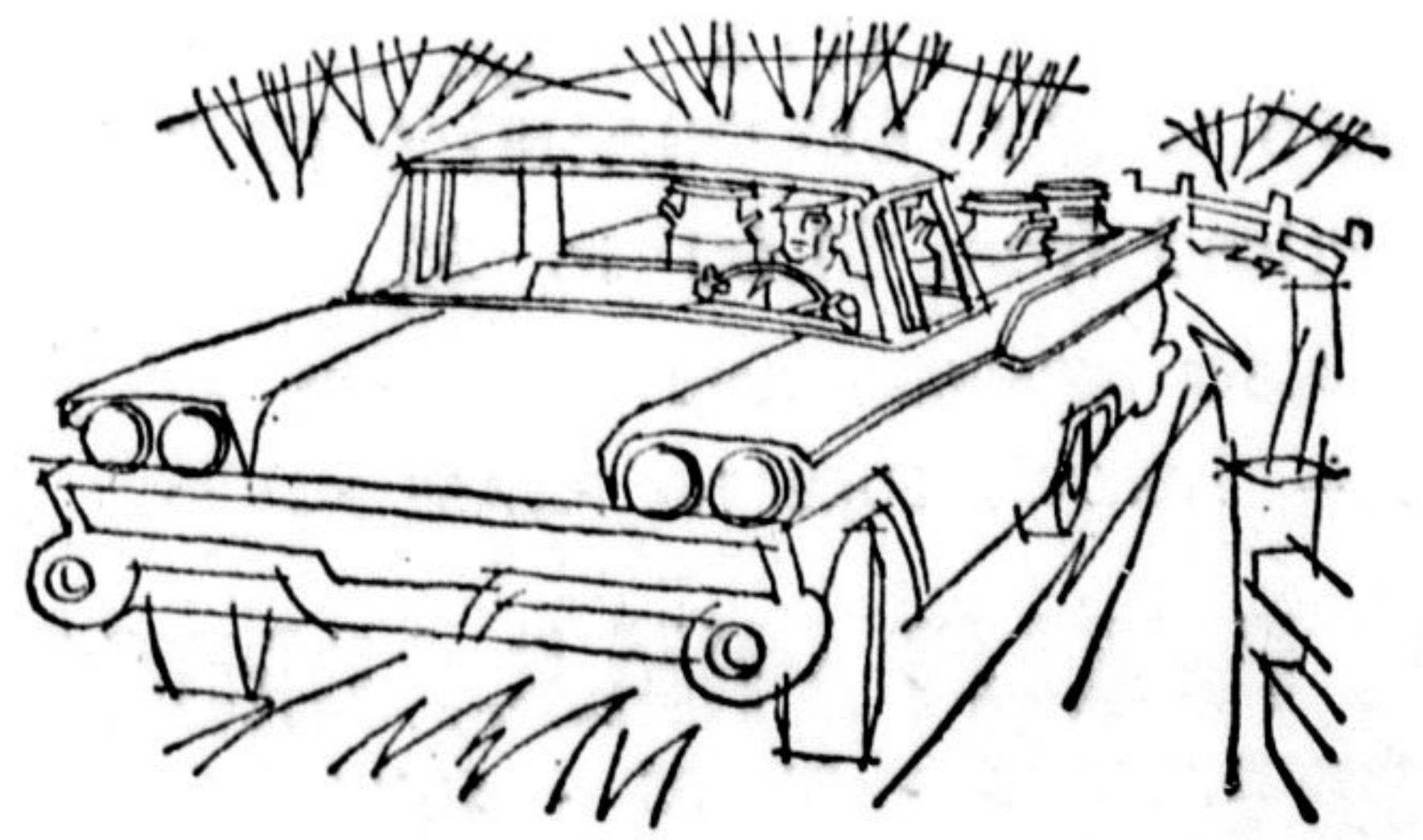
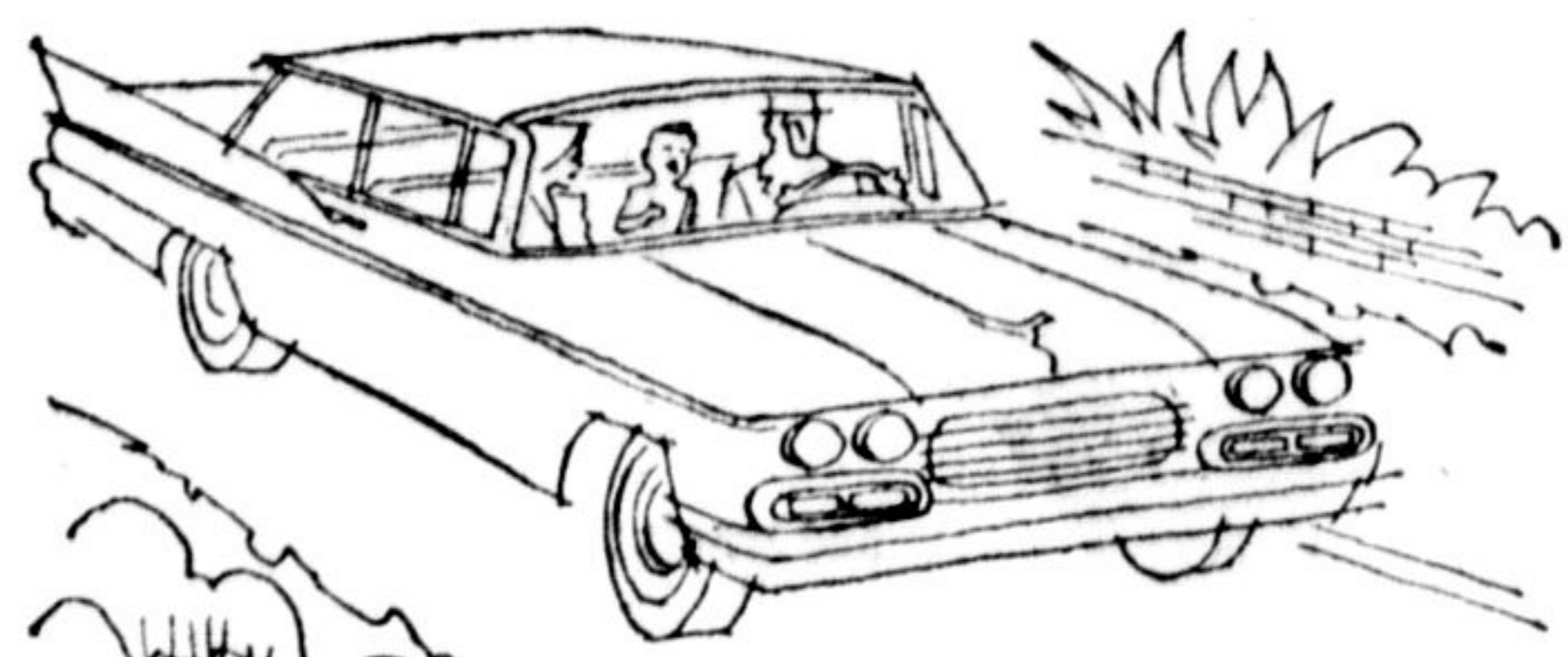
