THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF BURLINGTON

By-Law Number 1723

A By-law to prohibit the establishment or making of pits and quarries

WHEREAS pursuant to Paragraph 6 of Sub-section 1 of Section 27A of the Planning Amendment Act, 1959, municipalities are permitted to pass by-laws to prohibit the making or establishing of pits and quarries in their territory;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Burlington hereby enacts as follows:

(1) DEFINITION:
In this by-law "Quarry" shall mean any pit, quarry or excavation for, or removal of any soil, earth, clay, marl, sand, gravel, limestone, marble or other non-metallic mineral.

(2) That pursuant to Paragraph 6 of Sub-section 1 of Section 27A of the Planning Amendment Act, 1959, the making or establishing of pits and quarries in the Town of Burlington is hereby prohibited.

(3) That no part of this by-law shall come into force without the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board, but subject to such approval, this by-law shall take effect from the passing thereof.
