Announce Limits Pheasant Hunt

Hunting seasons for pheasants have just been announced by the Department of Lands and Forests. Daily limit is three birds, of which not more than one may be a female.

Dates are: October 17-21, Oxford County; October 14-31, counties of Brant, Bruce, Dufferin, Grey, Halton, Huron, Peel, Perth, Simcoe, Waterloo, Wellington, Wentworth and Ontario county except for the townships of East Whitby, Pickering and Whitby; October 21-31, townships of East Gwillimbury, King, Markham, Vaughan and Whitchurch in York County and also the townships of East Whitby, Pickering and Whitby in Ontario county; October 24 to November 7, counties of Elgin, Haldimand, Kent, Lambton, Lincoln, Middlesex, Norfolk and Welland; October 10-31 the remainder of the province with the exception of Essex county.
