The juvenile section now boasts five entries with Hespeler, Oakville, Brampton, Milton and Georgetown. Hespeler and Milton Sport and Cycle crew are OMHA "B" entries while the balance of the league are Minor "A".

The league will send a letter of protest to the OHMA regarding the Elmira Juveniles and Midgets who, although playing in a Junior "C" league will receive a bye to OMHA playdowns, while the rules state any player who plays more than three junior games after December 1 is ineligible for OMHA play.

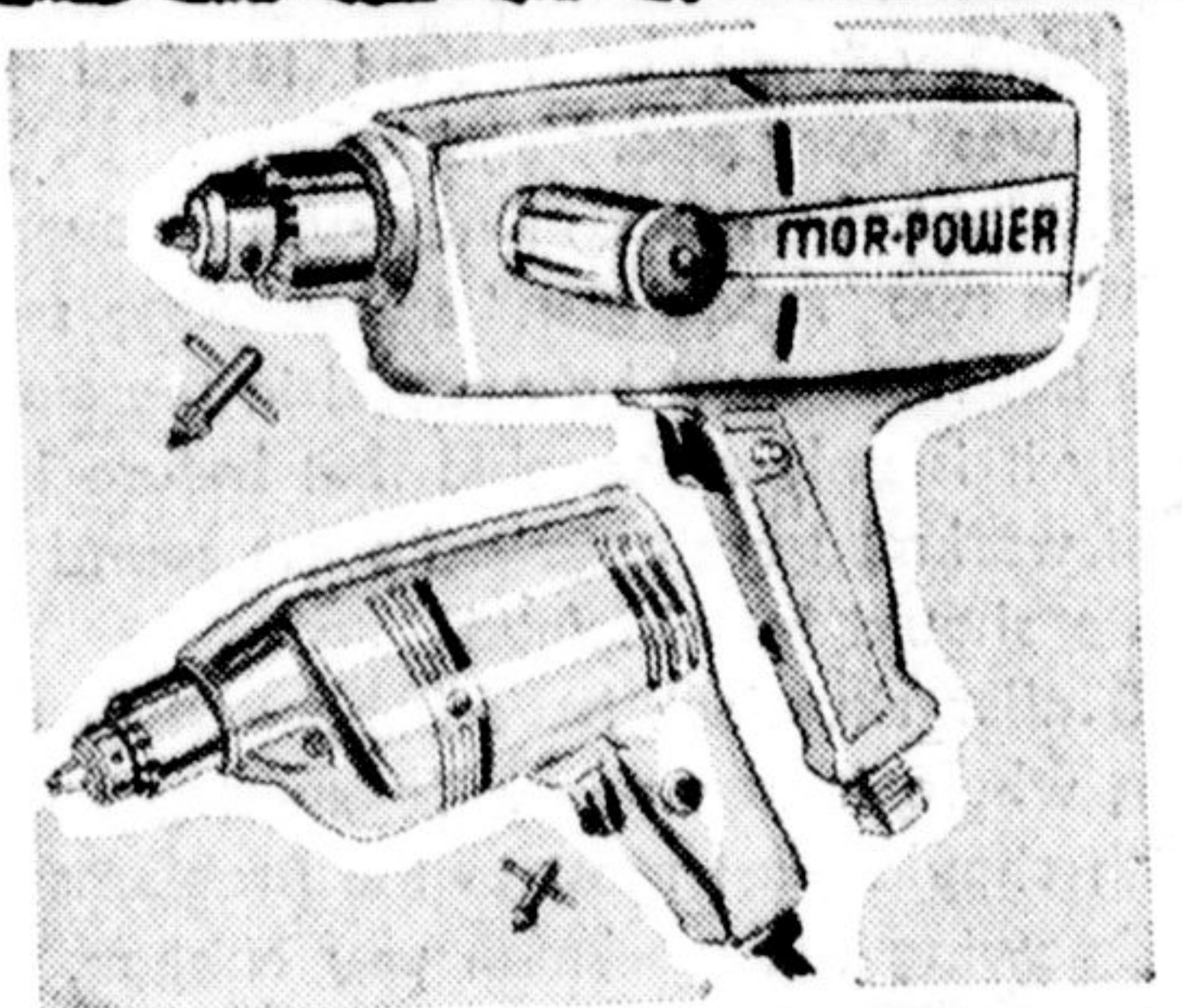

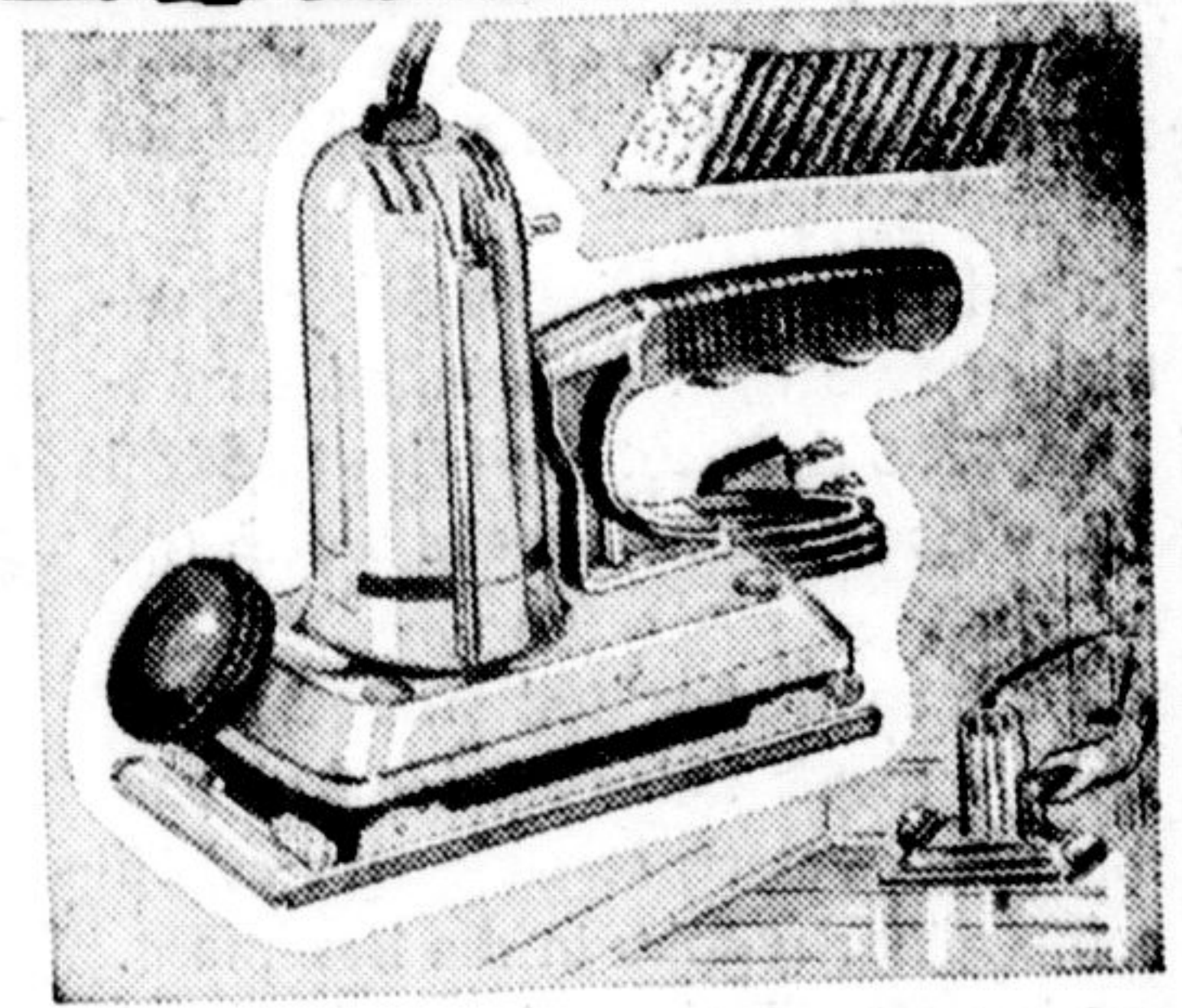
