THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TRAFALGAR
By-Law No. 1959-134
A By-law to amend By-law 1958-48.

WHEREAS the Land Use Committee of the Township of Trafalgar has recommended certain changes in the By-law Numbered 1958-48.

AND WHEREAS on the 22nd of October, 1959, the Planning Board by motion adopted the Committee's Report and recommended to Council that the zoning by-law be amended.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Trafalgar deems it desirable to amend the zoning by-law in accordance with the recommendation of the Planning Board.

AND WHEREAS this by-law has been approved by order of the Ontario Municipal Board on the day of 19.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TRAFALGAR ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:
1. That By-law No. 1958-48 be and the same is hereby amended as follows:
(i) Sec. 6 E 1 - Permitted Uses delete:
"Synthetic dry cleaning establishments."
Body repair shops,
Fuel oil and ice dealers,
Farm equipment dealers,
Undertaking establishments,"
add:
"Appliance sales and service,
Beauty salons,
Barber shops,
Service shops, but not including auto body repair shops,
Private clubs and fraternal organizations,
"Taxi establishments".
(ii) Sec. 7 A 12 - Commercial Uses for "6A to 6C" substitute "6A and 6E".
2. This By-law shall come into full force and effect upon receiving approval by the Ontario Municipal Board.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO THE LEGISLATURE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Corporation of the Township of Oakville and the Corporation of the Township of Trafalgar intend to apply to the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario for an Act:

(a) Establishing a joint public utilities commission consisting of five members of whom two are to be elected at large by the electors of Oakville and two to be elected at large by the electors of Trafalgar and the fifth (the chairman) is to be appointed by the electors of both municipalities.

(b) Entrusting to the Commission the control and management of the water production and distribution systems of both municipalities and of the electricity supply system of Oakville and of a part or all of that of Trafalgar as may be appropriate after a study thereof by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario, giving to the Commission the control and management of other public utilities and like services in the two municipalities whenever such may be entrusted by by-laws passed concurrently by both municipalities.

(c) Providing for the payment of operating and capital costs of the Commission insofar as they are not provided out of the rates charged for future capital works by the Commission and the provision of the money required therefor by the respective assessments or as may be otherwise agreed between them or ordered by The Ontario Municipal Board.

(d) Governing the establishment of rates to be charged by the Commission for the services supplied by it and for the application of its revenues and generally regulating the operations of the Commission and giving it the powers necessary to enable it to control and manage the public utilities and other services entrusted to it in the interest of the inhabitants of both municipalities.

Photo Tips

Capture Fair, Circus Photos With Good Flash, Fast Film

Circuses, carnivals and fairs all provide opportunities for exciting enjoyment. And through pictures, the pleasure of these events can be kept alive for years.

A simple camera with flash equipment or fast films for available light photography with adjustable cameras can capture all the mood and action of fairs and circuses.

What does the amateur need to know in order to bring back appealing pictures from his family's visit to a fair or circus?

First, say photographic authorities of Canadian Kodak Company, he must realize the importance of planning pictures and sequences before he shoots them.

Some of the photographic opportunities at these events require fast shutter snapping in order to catch a scene that can't be repeated. Other pictures, however, require planning and posing. This is particularly true of pictures that show members of the family as they look over the attractions of the side-

shows or animal cages or pause at refreshment stands. While a photograph of a performing clown may be a fine one, it can be made more personal if the clown is contributing to the laughter of one of the photographer's children, who is visible in the picture.

Avoid Lineups
In posing your subjects, try to avoid a straight line-up of people looking at the camera. Select a point of interest in the foreground and centre the subjects' interest upon it.

Added interest can be lent a sequence of pictures if the photographer varies the angle and distance from which he takes them. A close-up can be followed by a picture taken from a point farther away. Holding the camera high then low brings more intriguing results than if all photographs are taken at eye level.

Much activity at fairs and circuses takes place outdoors and even the simplest camera will find enough light to take good pictures. But today, new development in films and flash permit the photographer to keep right on taking pictures inside the circus tent or carnival arena.

Use Flash
Most cameras can be easily equipped with a flash attachment and bulbs pack enough light to make sharp pictures, particularly close-

ups of the attractions and the reactions they provoke among people in the audience.

For the photographer who uses an adjustable camera—one with a variable lens opening and shutter speed — fast new photographic films allow pictures to be made indoors even under relatively poor light conditions. Directions packed with the film and an exposure meter, if that is part of the picture-taker's equipment, serve as guides to the exposures that produce best results.
