Brick Employee Burned in Fire

Pietro Basegio, an employee of Milton Brick Co. Ltd., is in Milton District Hospital with 40 per cent. of his body burned and suffering from severe burn shock, following a fire at the area plant at 2.00 a.m. Wednesday.

Breaks Oil Line

OWRC Contracts Include Georgetown

Construction contracts valued at \$1,855,058.15 have been awarded in connection with projects at Nepean township, Tillsonburg, Georgetown, Hespeler and Bath, chairman A. M. Snider of the Ontario Water Resources Commission announced today.

Georgetown Job

Three separate contracts for sewers and two pumping stations at Nepean township, west of Ottawa, totalled \$730,214.99, while two awards in connection with a sewerage system at Tillsonburg totalled \$563,048.81. Frid Construction Company Limited of Hamilton will build Georgetown's sewage treatment plant for \$494,850.

A \$31,954.99 contract for Hespeler's sanitary sewers and a water-main was awarded to Alex Contracting of Georgetown, Ont.
