Auditorium, 12 Rooms in Milton High School Planned for Student Occupancy in September

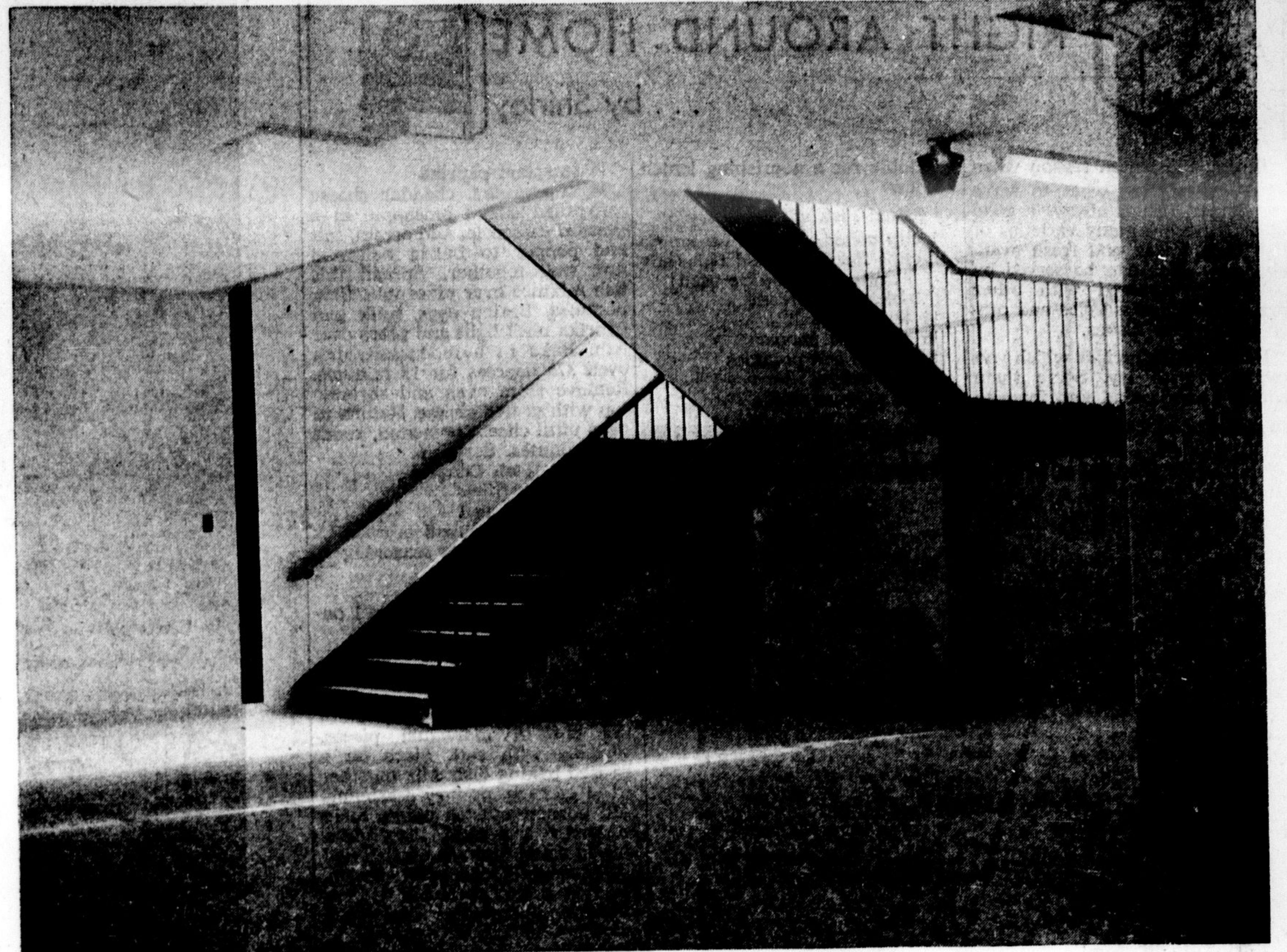
Milton's modern new 12-room high school is shaping up for September occupancy at Milton's southern town boundary these days as workmen hurry along inside jobs in the 12 classrooms and auditorium.

Modern Auditorium
The large new school on two floors features the most modern auditorium-gymnasium in the district, with a large floor area, stage, bleacher seating along one side, and washrooms, lockers and showers beneath the seating section.

There are five general classrooms downstairs, along with washrooms, principal's and teachers' rooms, offices and boiler room. Two modern staircases have been installed at each end of the upstairs classroom area, where five general classrooms and two science rooms are now in the stages of being finished and furnished.

Circular Drive
Outside, the building features a large parking area and a circular drive will lead to the sheltered front entrance. Situated on 10 acres of land recently annexed to the town, the school is on the extension of Williams Avenue, south of Parkway Drive.

The present high school on Martin St. contains 12 rooms plus shop and home economics facilities, with a small auditorium. Enrolment there this year is over 300 students and a larger student body is expected next year.

The W.A. of St. George's met at the home of Mrs. Joseph Harris and Miss Margaret Harris on the afternoon of March 9.

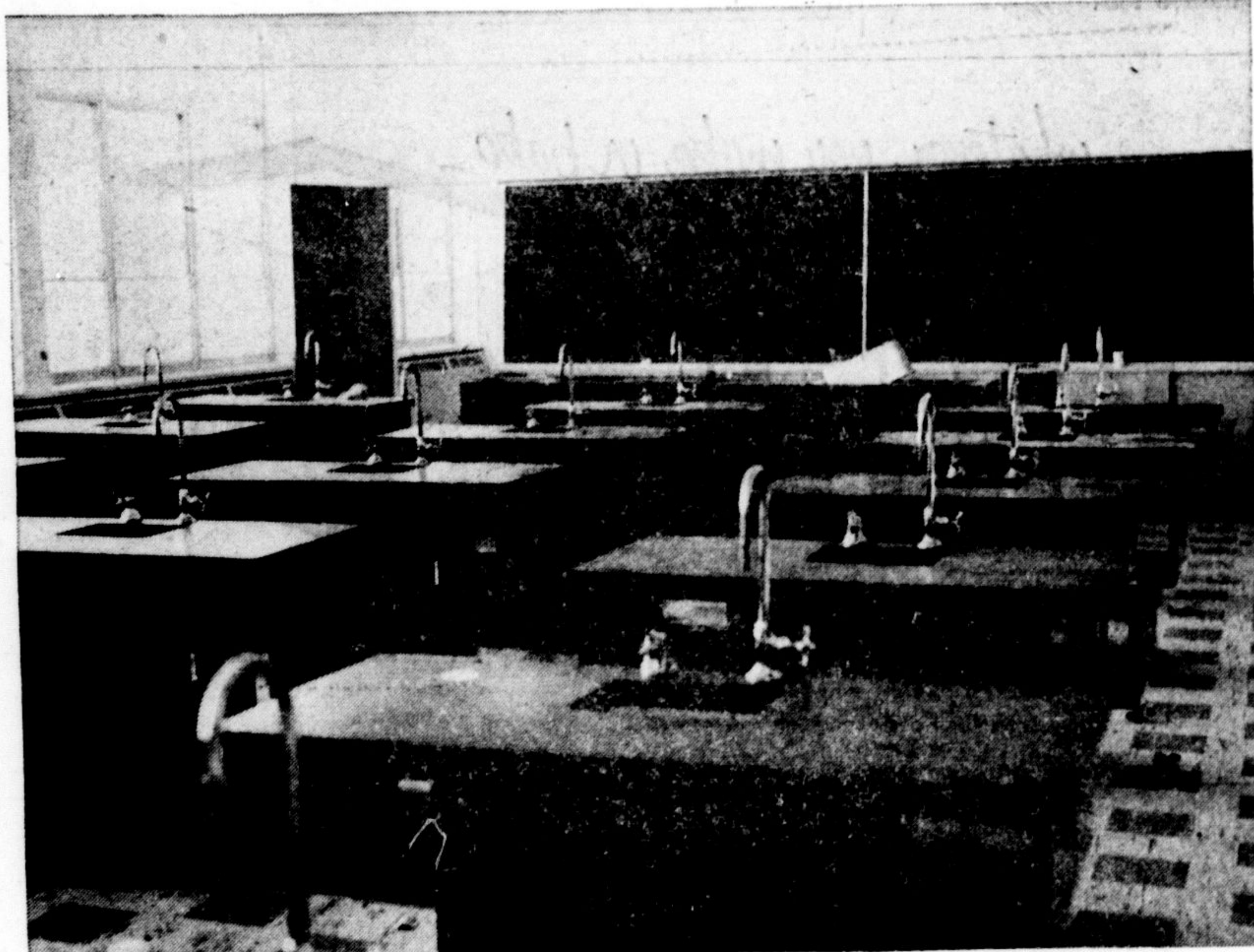

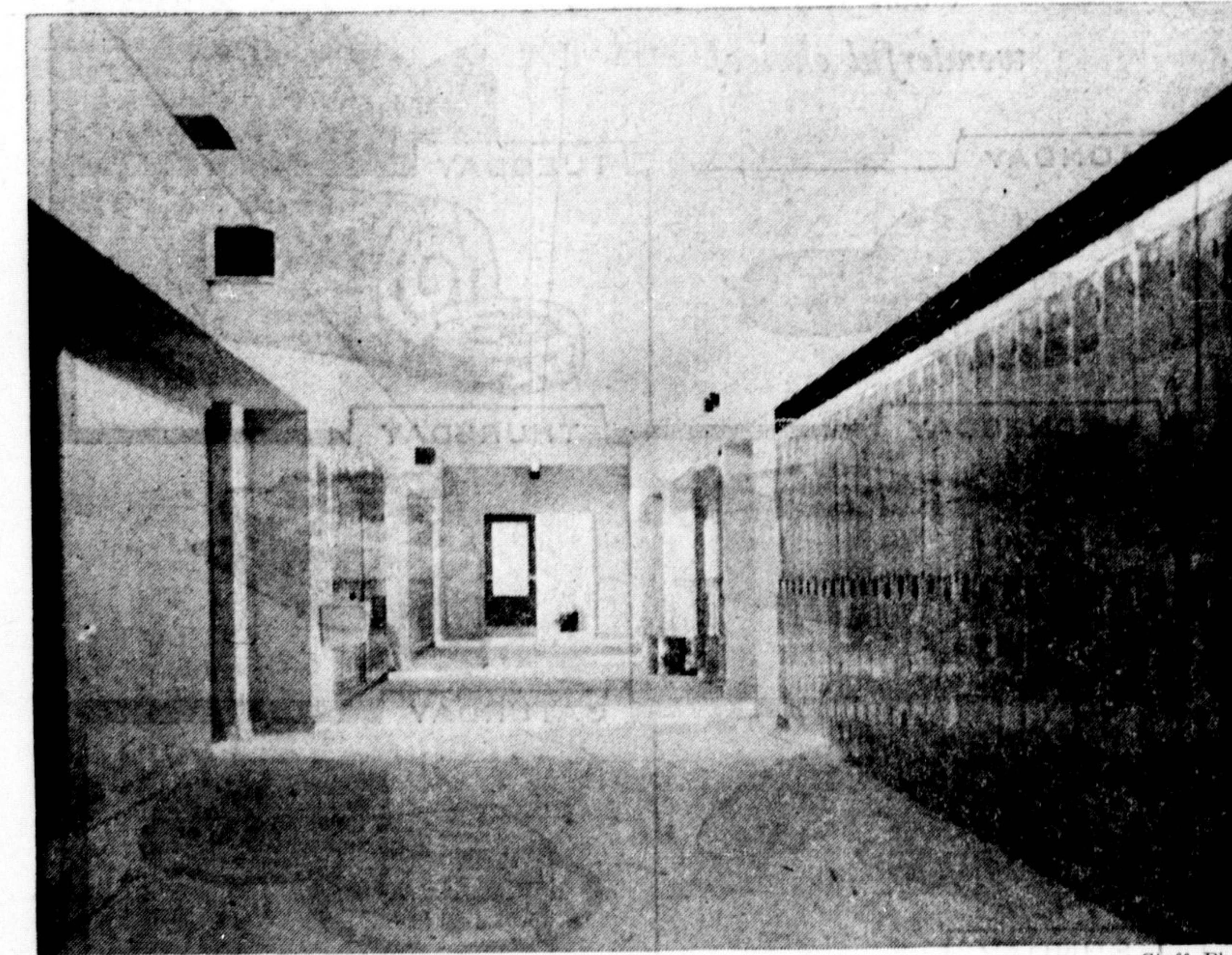
African Study

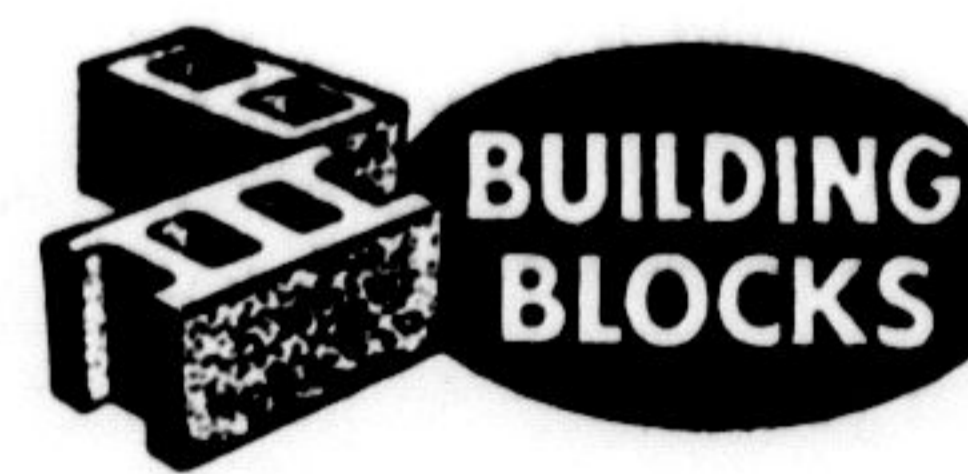
