**Commission Plans Paint-Up Will Paint Light Standards**

Milton Hydro Electric Commission, at its regular monthly meeting Tuesday, decided to paint the street light standards on Main St. this year. It was noted this would contribute to the improvement of the Main St. appearance.

The commission received warnings of difficulty in the Toronto area with bogus hydro representatives. It was explained homeowners were finding a group of supposed hydro workmen at the door to check for "interference". While one kept the owner occupied the others ransacked the house. Another instance was where an individual posing as a hydro workman sought accommodation, ransacked the house and didn't have any money to pay for his lodging "until his pay cheque came through".

Commissioners urged Milton residents to contact the local office if any similar situations developed locally.

Accounts totalling \$29,723.02 were approved for payment. It was agreed to close the business office at 5 p.m. in conjunction with the initiation of daylight saving time.
