

Travelling Trout Makes Niagara Falls

TORONTO-Ontario Lands and Forests officials here say that it is highly likely that rainbow trout which started out from a tributary of Lake Erie near the Pennsylvania-New York border and travelled more than 200 miles to the eastern end of Lake Ontario successfully negotiated Niagara Falls instead of travelling through the locks of the Welland Canal.

The trout, 17 inches long, gained more than seven inches in length and added 1½ pounds during the long journey. It was taken in a gill net near Picton seven and a half months after leaving Twenty Mile Creek where, a tag showed, it had been planted by the Pennsylvania Fish Commis-

sion. Previously, a yearling, planted in May, 1958 in the Ocqueoc River, northern Lake Huron, was recaptured in the Bay of Quinte eight months later. The fish, 18 inches long, had travelled 600 miles, gained better than nine inches in length and also, presumably, had survived the 185-foot drop over the Niagara cataract.


