Grants Permit Better Parks

W. G. Davis, M.P.P. (Peel) announced last week that the government of Ontario has approved two grants to the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

The Terra Cotta conservation area, 310 acres in Esquering and Chinguacousy townships will, due to a government grant of \$7,750 (50 per cent. of estimated costs), be developed this year. A change house and refreshment booth will be constructed for visitors to the area, while the picnic area will be sodded and landscaped.

Roadways and parking areas will be gravelled. Improvements will also be made to the pond wall and dyke and a dam will be constructed at the outlet of the Big Pond.

Mr. Davis also announced that a change house will be built at the Belfountain Conservation Area at the Forks of the Credit. The government will contribute 50 per cent. or \$3,000 of the costs of this as well as repairs to the stone and concrete dam on the property.

"Belfountain," Mr. Davis said, "was acquired in 1959 by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority and with the addition of the change house, many thousands of residents of the area, as well as visitors, should be able to enjoy the site in 1960."
