Freak Accident Kills Girl, 15

A 15-year-old Georgetown girl was killed and three others received minor injuries Monday afternoon in a freakish accident on Highway 7's "Wildwood Curve" near the outskirts of Georgetown.

Constance Bastedo of 7 William St., Georgetown, was killed instantly when she was run over, police believe by a car driven by John D. Wright of Brampton. Const. William Bennett of North Halton O.P.P. explained the girl was a rear seat passenger in a car driven by William F. Engleby of 11 Kennedy St., Georgetown, which went out of control on the curve. It reportedly hit a signpost and as it rolled over, the girl was thrown from the car. Mr. Wright, following the Engleby vehicle, did not see the girl for the dust caused by the first car, and police believe his car hit the girl.

She was pronounced dead at the scene by coroner Dr. Chamberlain of Georgetown.
