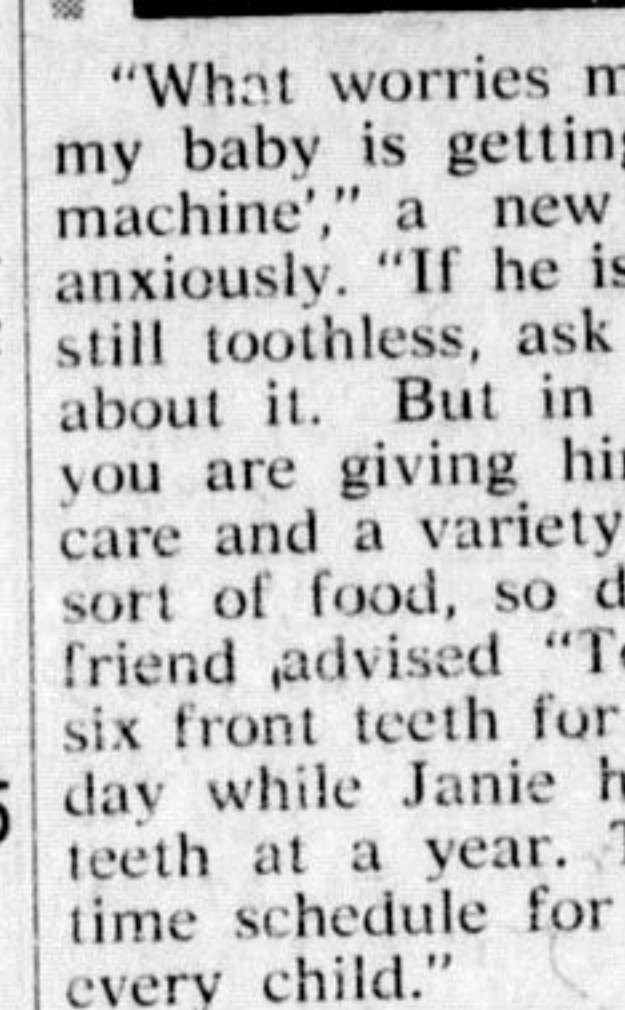

Those First Teeth

"What worries me is how slow my baby is getting his 'chewing machine,'" a new mother said anxiously. "If he is a year and is still toothless, ask your doctor about it. But in the meantime, you are giving him the best of care and a variety of the right sort of food, so don't fuss," her friend advised. "Tommy had his six front teeth for his first birthday while Janie had only two teeth at a year. There's no one time schedule for first teeth for every child."

This mother was quite right in pointing out that children vary greatly in their development and teething is no exception to this rule. Some babies get their teeth very early, others around seven or eight months and a few babies don't cut their teeth until towards the end of their first year. There is no relation between a child's I.Q. and the early appearance of teeth. A bright child may be slow in cutting his teeth.

Differ in Health
Babies differ, too, in their physical well-being during teething time. Some babies cut their teeth with the minimum of discomfort. To her surprise, mother discovers that the point of a new tooth has come through the gum some morning. The mother is fortunate whose baby follows this pattern! So is the baby!

Other babies suffer a good deal of pain getting the first set of 20 teeth in two and a half years. It is not right to blame every little upset on teeth. But a child's resistance, in some cases, seems to be lowered when teeth are coming through.

Usually the first two teeth to appear are the lower centre teeth which are called incisors because of their sharp cutting edge. Then the four upper incisors are cut. Many babies have these six teeth at a year.

The baby (and his mother) often have a rest from teething for a little while before the eruption of the two remaining lower incisors and the four first molars. These larger molar teeth are made for chewing and grinding food and the baby's gums are sometimes quite sore when he is getting them.

Dog Teeth
There is little space between the incisors and the molars for the pointed canines (or "dog teeth") which often are cut late in the second year. The last four teeth are the second molars, which come in back of the first molars. Baby as a rule gets this final instalment to his set, the first part of his third year.

It is natural for baby to want to chew anything he can lay his hands on when he is cutting teeth. If mother isn't careful, he may swallow small objects as a wheel off a miniature car. The point on a child's toys or furniture should be without lead which might harm baby if he sucked it.

Mother will have a constant occupation if she tries to keep things out of baby's mouth when he is teething. It is better to buy him a good teething ring which can be frequently and quickly sterilized with boiling water.

Adequate Diets
The crowns of all the baby's teeth are formed in his gums before birth and the crowns of

his permanent teeth are being formed in the first months of the baby's life. That is why adequate diets for pregnant women include milk and cheese, with their calcium and phosphorus, oranges and citrus fruit with their vitamin C and cod liver oil (vitamin D) are so essential. The baby's milk intake must be supplemented by vitamin D in fish oils and vitamin C in orange juice according to the doctor's direction.

Teething time may be a fretful time for baby, but the healthy child should get through this period without too much trouble. Rubbing baby's gums is sometimes soothing. Don't be afraid of spoiling him by picking him up and holding him if he is miserable!

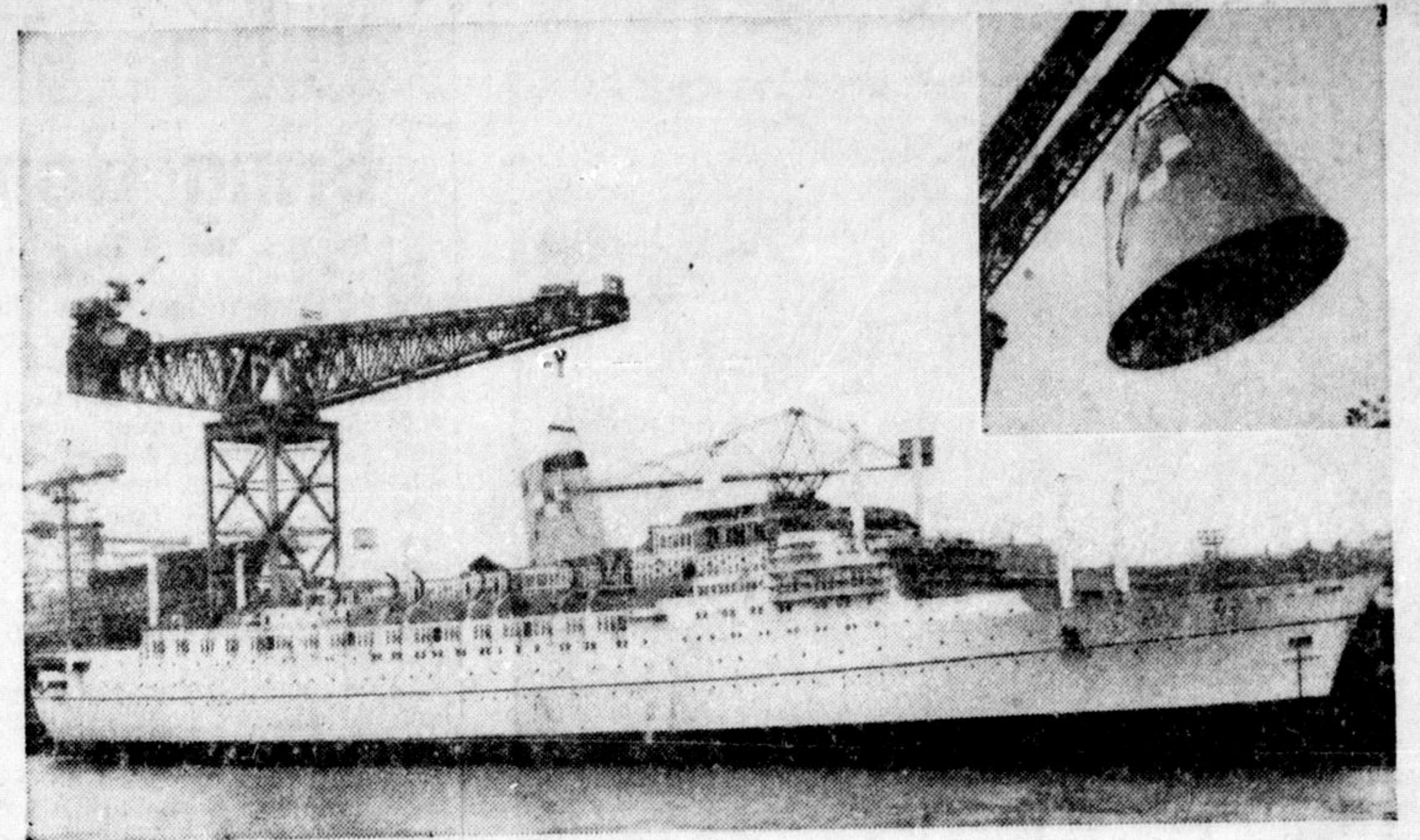
BRIEFS

GIANT FUNNEL IN PLACE:—One of the finishing touches to the superstructure of the new Canadian Pacific liner Empress of Canada — the placing of her giant 64-ton steel and aluminum funnel — was completed October 8. The 27,300-ton liner, launched last May is scheduled to go into service between Liverpool and Montreal in April 1961. Owing to the weight of the huge funnel, the ship had to be moved from her fitting out berth at the Vickers-Armstrongs Yard at Newcastle-on-Tyne, England, down to where the giant hammer-head crane was holding suspended the gleaming buff colored funnel with its red and white checkered house flag. The whole operation of lifting, moving the ship, and putting the funnel into position was completed in 60 minutes.
