Tips on Photography

Scenics Offer Wealth of Material

Down the open road with your camera! That's a thrill, anywhere—anytime. Let's think about what makes a good scenic...

Landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes all offer a wealth of scenic material. Rolling hills or fertile farmlands, the beach at ebb tide, the city park or business section at dusk represent only a few of the picture possibilities for your camera. The trick is to keep pictures of these subjects clear and simple and uncluttered. Concentrate on one point; don't try to include the man in the moon, his house and his wife in your scenic shots.

However, you can include a person, as long as the main center of interest is the overall scene itself and not the attitude or activity of the human being. Sometimes it's a good idea to have just one person in the foreground—either in profile or with his back to the camera—so he can lead the eye into the picture. Or a couple of people strategically spotted at the "center of interest."

By including people in your scenic snaps you establish some size scale which will tell something about the view. A landmark or mountain peak often appears much more impressive when it overshadows a human figure than when it's simply photographed by itself. Just remember: let the scene—and not people—dominate the picture. In snapping

this kind of photo you'll usually have plenty of time to look around and think about the subject before you shoot. Old man mountain isn't going to jump up and run away! Look carefully at the scene from many angles that pleases you most. Then fire away!

People Not A Must But don't think scenics must include people, or be limited to distant views. Very often subjects six feet away, or closer, will make very interesting and beautiful pictures. Keep your eyes peeled!

Other subjects included in the general category of scenics can be called "still life". We commonly think of a still life as a bowl of fruit, a beautiful flower arrangement, figurines, etc. You can, however, use a bit of ingenuity and create unusual subjects. For example, a mirror makes a fine "lake". Sand around the edges makes your beach and you can get miniature boats to add to the attractiveness of the scene. To simulate a forest background, twigs from a pine tree stuck into your sand beach will serve you well. There are innumerable possibilities for still life or "table top" studies.

PHOTO TIPS Is your memory sometimes hazy when you try to remember your camera? It's easy to forget whether that roll was black and white or color, or fast film or slow, believe it or not. Lacking a film reminder dial on your camera, apply a piece of adhesive

tape to the back of the camera, on the outside, of course. The type of film you put in can then be jotted down on the tape with a pencil—and erased when you use a different film.

★ Planning to make shots of the sunrise and sunset? You can get glorious effects on color film. At 1/50 shutter speed, with clear sky, set the camera lens at f/5.6, fifteen minutes before sundown (or sunrise). The lens should be set at f/4, five minutes before sundown (or sunrise); at f/2.8 just when the sun is at the horizon; and at f/2.8 up to fifteen minutes after. If the sunset or sunrise is clouded over, set the lens at f/2.8, fifteen minutes before sundown; at f/2, five minutes before; and at f/1.9 from sundown until fifteen minutes afterwards.

★ When taking exposure meter readings of close-up subjects, make quite sure that the meter is really close to the subject, and that light from neighboring objects does not affect the reading. It's also important that the meter does not cast a shadow where you are taking the reading. If it does, change your angle a bit since inclusion of the shadow may well cause your picture to suffer from overexposure.

In Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, ownership of the fine Bible House premises which were dedicated in February, 1947, "To the glory of God and the wider circulation of Holy Scriptures" was transferred from the American Bible Society to the Sociedade Biblica do Brasil.

The American Bible Society authorized this generous gesture in July of this year. Dr. Layton E. Holmgren, Executive Secretary, in handing over the deeds said, "With this gift go our hopes and prayers that in Brazil, as in all the world, the day will not be far distant when every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the Glory of the Father."

The occasion was also marked by the retirement of the two fraternal Secretaries, C. H. Morris of the British and Foreign Bible Society and O.K.K. Nelson of the American Bible Society.

The Brazil Bible Society has had phenomenal success in the distribution of the Scriptures since world war II.
