Public School Inspectorate Districts Same as Last Year

Public school inspectorate districts in Halton County remain unchanged this year, but one inspector has been added to the staff for Halton Inspectorate No. 1.
Orville G. McDowell has joined R. F. Bornhold in this inspectorate, which covers schools in the town of Oakville and Georgetown and the townships of Nassagaweya and Esquesing. On January 1, 1962, when Oakville and Trafalgar become one municipality, Oakville will probably be under the Oakville-Trafalgar Board of Education and will pull out of the Halton Inspectorate district.

W. L. McNeil remains in charge of Halton No. 4 and Wentworth No. 2 districts, including Acton, Milton, Waterdown, East and West Flamboro.
Trafalgar and Burlington support their own inspectors while J. D. Hogan continues as Separate School Inspector with jurisdiction over all Separate Schools in Halton and Wentworth Counties except the city of Hamilton.
Probable enrolments in the two inspectorates served from the Milton office by inspectors Bornhold, McNeil and McDowell total about 9,000 students. Trafalgar will have around 6,000 while Burlington expects 11,000.
