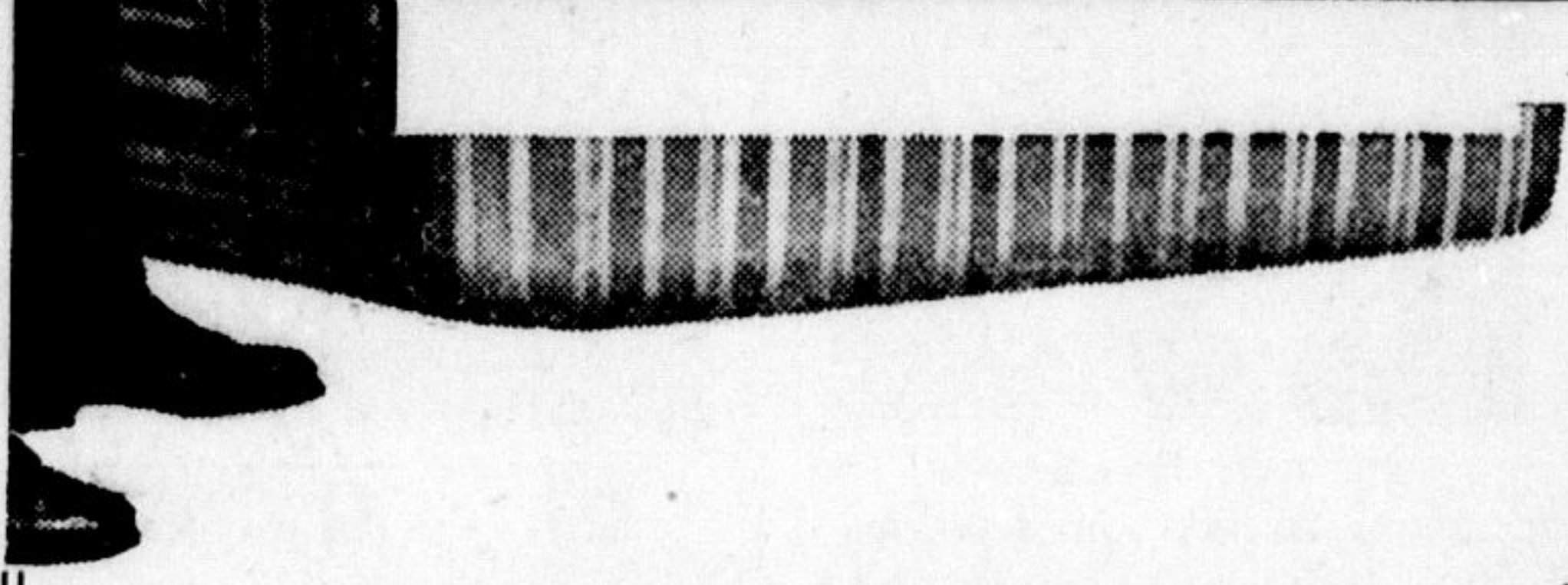
This Country
