## Crop Demonstration Program Outlines Improved Techniques

During the past week, the Halton Soil and Crop Improvement Association, in co-operation with farmers in Halton, has been setting out crop demonstrations.

The purpose of these demonstrations is to outline improved cropping techniques.

This program is carried out by the association in co-operation with the Extension Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture, and the Soils and Field Husbandry Departments of the Ontario Agricultural College.

In order to obtain more useful results, the Halton Soil and Crop Improvement Association is co-operating with associations in Peel, Wentworth and Lincoln counties.

### Various Projects

Included in the demonstration program are projects to demonstrate the value of soil testing in applying commercial fertilizers.

### Odds Against it

## Can Lightning Strike You?

What causes lightning? Is it really dangerous? What can you do about it? Oddly enough, as simple as the questions seem, few of us know the right answers. This is probably because the odds against being in the path of a lightning stroke are about a million to one.

However, Ontario is receiving more than its usual share of electrical storms this season, so it's obvious that however rare, lightning is a definite danger.

### It's Static

We can best understand it by knowing its cause. Lightning is a discharge of static electricity, which gradually builds up within a cloud until it breaks through the resistance of the air, and jumps between either charged parts of the cloud, or the cloud and the ground. Nine out of 10 of these lightning discharges never reach the ground.

Lightning tends to strike high, isolated points in the landscape — solitary trees, towers, buildings, and of course, people. A human being can be electrocuted if even a very small portion of a lightning discharge passes through the body.

### Danger on Water

What can you do about lightning? The Ontario Safety League advises your greatest danger is in open space or on water during an electrical storm. Tall buildings in built up areas usually provide protection. When out in the open during a storm, never seek shelter under a solitary tree. Head for thick woods. You're reasonably

safe in a car if it's stationary, or under a high tower if you don't touch its metal parts. Finally, if you're out in a boat, lie down, or if you're swimming when a storm breaks, head for shelter on land immediately.

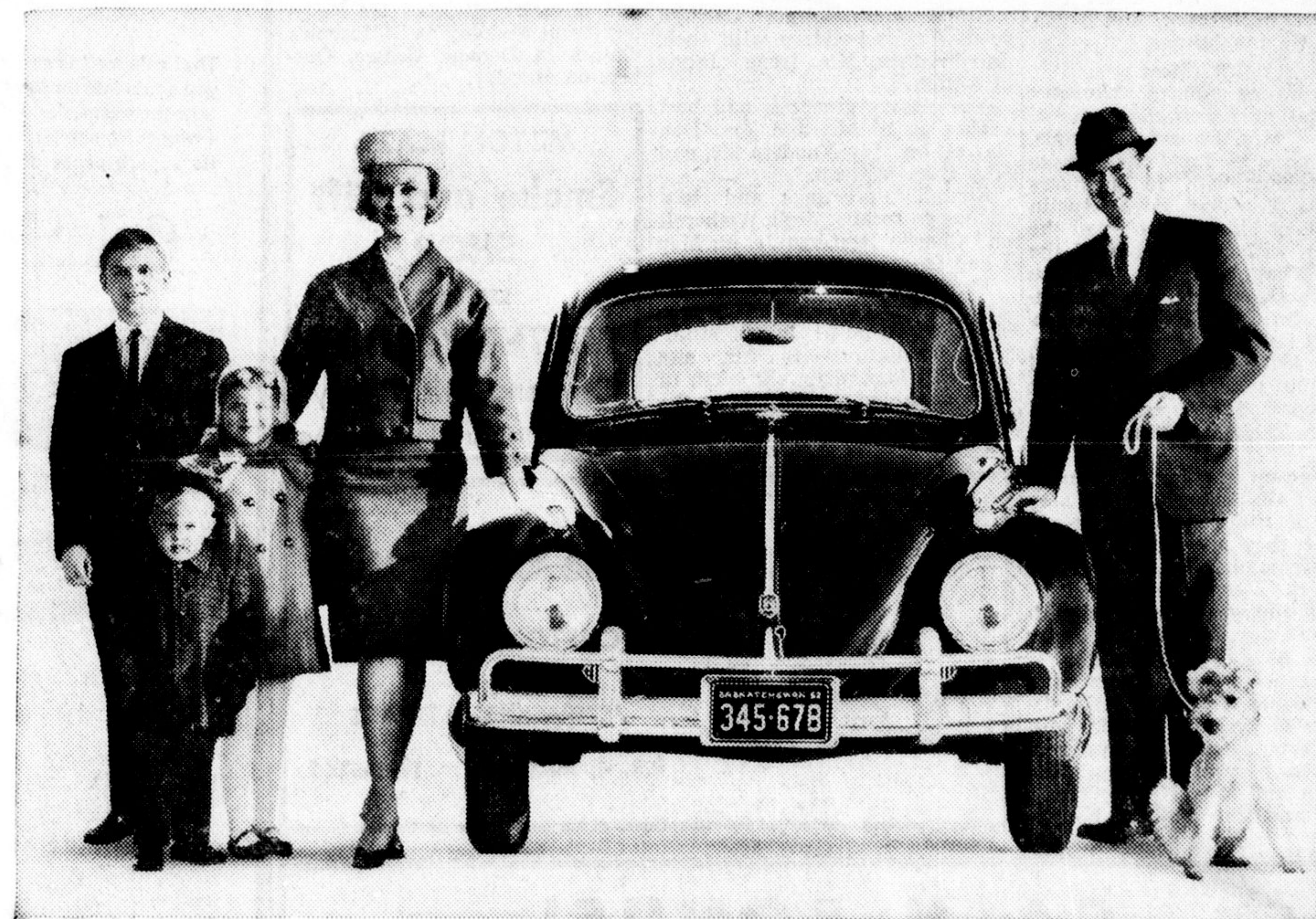

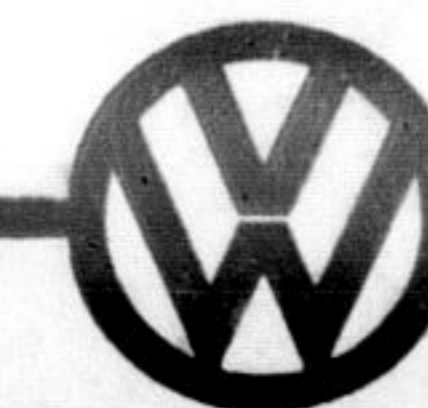
