By-Law No. 1962-66
A By-law to regulate the sale and setting off of fireworks in the Town of Oakville.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF OAKVILLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The term 'fireworks' shall include any combustible or explosive composition or any substance or combination of substances or article prepared for the purpose of producing an audible or visible effect by combustion or explosion.

2. Except as herein provided, no person shall sell, offer for sale, or expose for sale, or use, set off, or explode any fireworks at any time except during the fourteen day period prior to and on the day fixed by proclamation of the Governor-General for the celebration of Victoria Day and Dominion Day; provided further that on Sundays falling within the aforesaid period of 14 days, no person shall sell, offer for sale, or expose for sale, or use, set off or explode any fireworks.

3. No person shall sell fireworks at any time to any person who is not of the full age of sixteen years.

4. No person shall set off any fireworks in any public place or on any private property unless the consent of the owner of such property has first been secured.

5. No person shall advertise or hold or participate in any fireworks display without a permit therefor.

6. A permit may be issued by the Council for a fireworks display to be held at any time during the year upon the application of any person or organization.

7. Application for a permit shall be made in writing to the Council before the proposed display and the application shall indicate that the display is to be supervised by a responsible adult person in a place where it will not endanger persons or buildings and shall be accompanied by a report from the Chief Constable and a report from the Fire Chief on the place, location, supervision and safety precautions proposed for the display.

8. Any such display shall be conducted by the person or persons responsible for it in accordance with the proposal made in the application and any safety conditions imposed by Council when granting the permit.

9. The Police Department of the Town of Oakville shall be responsible for the enforcement of this By-law.

10. Any person who contravenes any provision of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$300.00, exclusive of costs, recoverable under the Summary Convictions Act.
