## Warns All Parents

### Children Playing in Streets

Chief Ray Andress of the Milton Police Department yesterday issued a severe warning to parents to keep their children from playing in the streets. The warning was precipitated by an incident Friday when a three year old girl, one of a group of children playing on Main St., walked into the side of a slow-moving auto. The child was luckily unhurt.

"Children playing in the streets are getting to be a big problem," the chief said. "If it keeps on this way, there will probably have to be a by-law passed forbidding children to play in the streets."

**Not Worth It**  
"Many parents won't let their children play on the lawn or in the yard because they don't want their grass trampled. All the

trampled grass in the province isn't worth the life of one child. You can re-seed your lawn; you can't replace your child.

"Anyone who has driven down our side streets, particularly in the subdivisions, realizes just what a problem this is. Suppose a drunk was to drive down one of these roads when all these children are playing.

"I would like to say to the parents just this: you must assume the responsibility. It is yours, not the Police Department's or the Safety Council's. What good is safety taught in the schools if it is not taught and practiced at home? Keep your child off the streets—it could save his or her life."

## ORAL POLIO VACCINE

Dr. Bull of Halton County Health Unit has announced the following clinics for the administration of Oral Polio Vaccine. Please check the schedule for your nearest school.

All age groups should receive this Vaccine whether or not they have been previously immunized with Salk Vaccine. Maximum immunity is obtained by the use of Salk Vaccine and the new Vaccine, and it is hoped that poliomyelitis can be eliminated entirely by the effective use of these two immunizing agents. Please urge your friends and neighbours to attend one of these schools. Adult clinics will be held from 7.00 to 9.00 p.m. at the schools indicated on the schedule. There will be no evening clinic at the High Schools.
