# Women to Mark Day of Prayer

On March 1, Canadian women will gather in large city churches, prairie farm houses and even in Eskimo igloos to pray for peace and brotherhood with women from 15 other countries.

The first Friday in Lent is the Women's World Day of Prayer, in which Canadians have participated for 35 years.

The theme this year is "More Than Conquerors," and the service which will be used by all countries was written by a committee headed by Mrs. David Chung of Korea.

Mrs. Chung came to Canada in 1956 to study women's work in the United Church of Canada, then accompanied her husband to Yale University, where she studied Christian education.

She returned to Korea in 1958 and now is general secretary of the Women's Evangelistic Society there.

Contributions made at the services are used to aid 96 causes. Those made by Canadian women are used mainly to help refugees and to publish and distribute Christian literature.

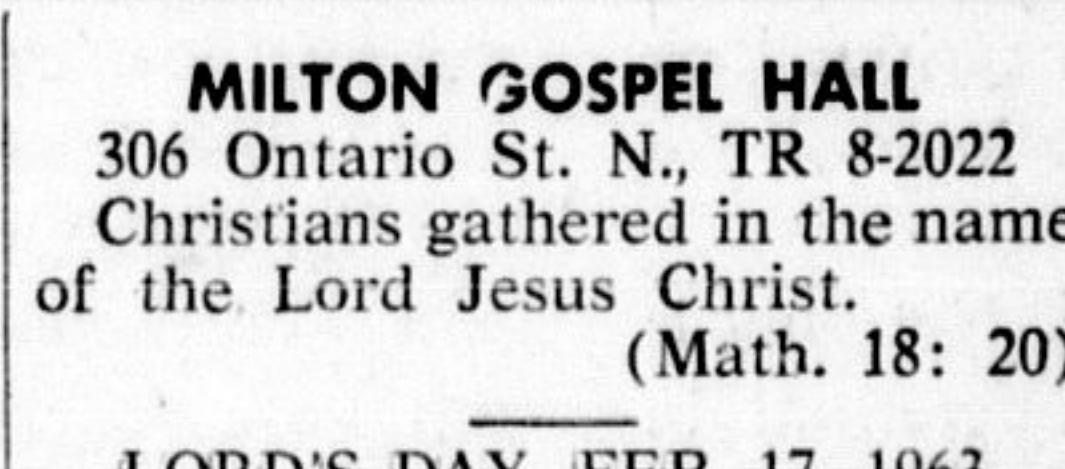
