## Horticultural Notes

### ROSE CULTURE

Now that your roses are established and ready to blossom, they should have plenty of water. Cultivate them very shallow and work in some good nitrogen fertilizer or bone meal around the plant about nine inches out from the plant and mulch them with peat moss or compost. Mulching helps to keep the soil cooler and reduces the loss of moisture. The soil should be thoroughly soaked them, not sprinkled. Roses should never be sprinkled as this causes mildew and black spot. Lay the hose on the ground around the bushes. A good time is early in the morning, then the

moisture dries through the day. About one-inch of rainfall each week is ideal because roses are very deep rooted. Spray or dust your roses regularly, about every 7 days, often if it rains. There are many good rose dusts and sprays on the market.

### CHRYSANTHEMUMS OR MUMS

If you have mums in the garden or in pots in the house, you can divide them into small clumps or each little shoot will grow if it is rooted. Work the soil up good, add some peat moss or compost, and some bone meal, and plant in rows; or you can put them in your perennial border as they make a wonderful display in the border in the fall.
