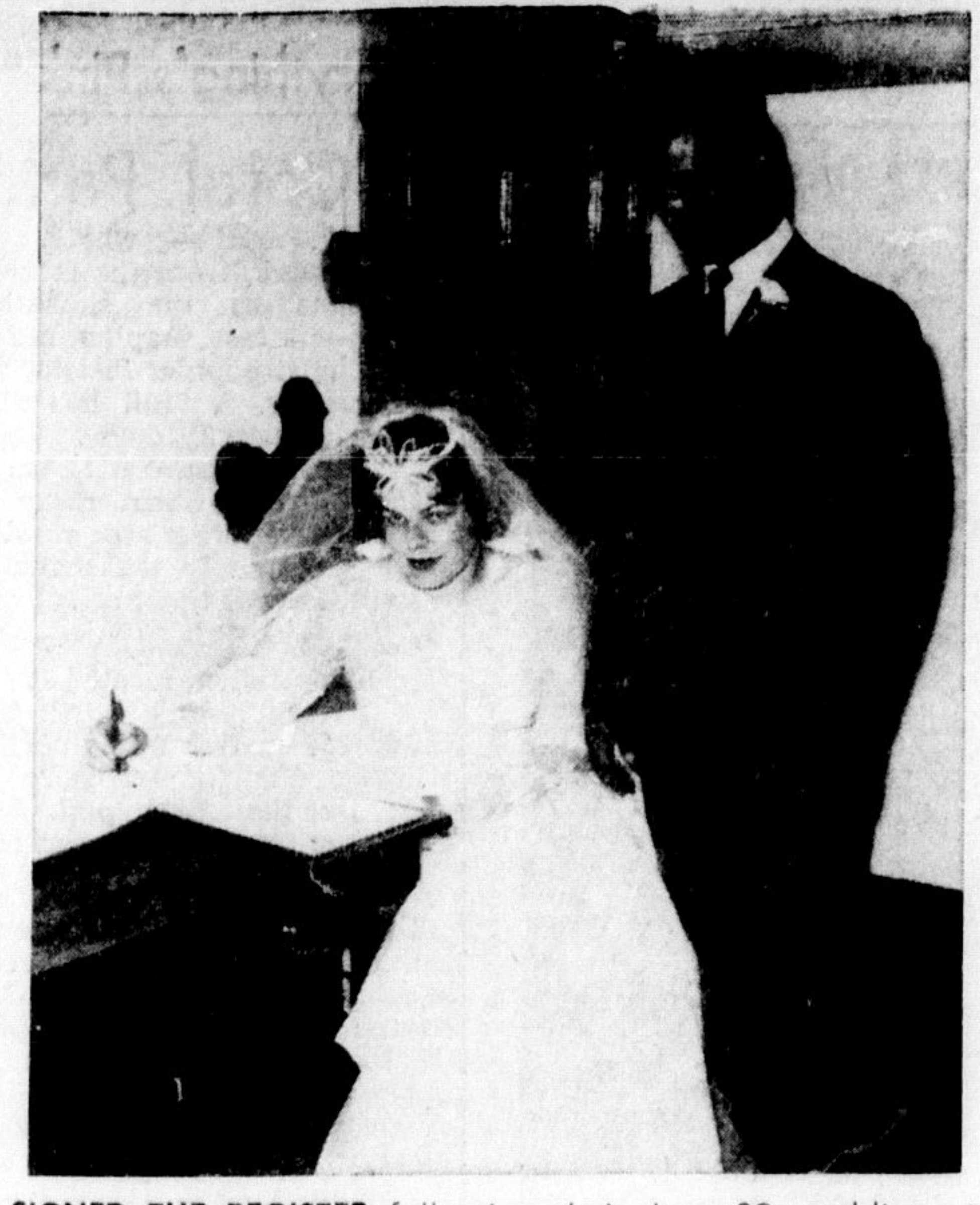

Protestants and Roman Catholics recently united to foster a wider use of the Bible in Holland. In Utrecht, during a two-hour period, some eighteen hundred Dutch Catholics and Protestants rang the door-bells of about eighty thousand homes, giving to each householder a copy of a pamphlet entitled "Why the Bible?"

This one-eight campaign was the result of a drive to sell Bibles, and get them read throughout the city of Utrecht. Similar plans are being made for other Dutch cities.

**Rediscovery of Bibles**  
Father Gregory Baum recently announced from Edmonton that an important result of the "dialogues" between Roman Catholics and Protestants in Canada has been a rediscovery of the Bible by Catholics. Father Baum was a consultant to the secretariat for promoting Christian unity. He is a Jewish-born Canadian converted to the Roman Catholic faith.

being laid for the erecting of nine cottages on the property, finished in a rustic design like the barn. These will be rented to members wishing to spend summer vacations there.

On a meadow near the clubhouse lies the 150 by 50 foot swimming pool, ranging in depth from three to 10 feet, and built at a cost of \$65,000. The water is completely filtered and two life-guards are on duty weekends.

**Weekend Hikes**  
Nearby is a children's playground, outfitted with swings. Linda Stanfield is playground supervisor on weekends, and takes over 30 children on a weekly Sunday hike while their parents golf, swim, or laze in the sun.

The nine-hole golf course will be expanded by next year, but the owners are still debating whether to devote their time to improving the nine holes, or extending the course to a full 18. The 2,880 yard course features plenty of challenging golf, with trees, rocks and other hazards dotting the course.

Jack Stanfield, a former Kitchener and St. Catharines Tee Pees hockey player who last year wore the colors of Philadelphia in the Eastern Pro League, is the golf pro. He was assistant pro last year at Pine Valley, Toronto. Bill Vales of Campbellville is greens-keeper.

**No Initiation Fee**  
Golf costs just \$25 over the initial club membership, and for 1963 you're allowed to join with no initiation fee.

Two doubles courts are available in the fenced-off tennis area with a red clay base for the courts. Gary Adams is tennis instructor and gives lessons every weekend.

The archery range is located behind the clubhouse, with complete archery equipment available. A skeet shooting area is being developed nearby, for use this fall.

This winter, members will be offered the use of the nearby Glen Eden Ski Tows, as well as skating and tobogganing at the club.

**Complete as Possible**  
Manager Kriss explains Birch Hills is designed to be as modern and as complete as possible. An example is the outdoor theatre, featuring comedies and plays from Shakespeare. Planned to open this year, it had to be held up a year because the director took ill.

He explained the club is available to groups wishing to use the golf, swimming, or dining room facilities, except Saturdays.

The Saturday evening dances are open to the public, as well as the International Festival Dinners served 6 p.m. to 1 p.m. Saturdays, featuring foods from many lands. German, Italian, and Chinese dishes have highlighted the Saturday dinners to date, and a splash dance (dance till 11, swim till 1 a.m. with music by the pool) is on the agenda for next Saturday.

Protestants and Roman Catholics recently united to foster a wider use of the Bible in Holland. In Utrecht, during a two-hour period, some eighteen hundred Dutch Catholics and Protestants rang the door-bells of about eighty thousand homes, giving to each householder a copy of a pamphlet entitled "Why the Bible?"

This one-eight campaign was the result of a drive to sell Bibles, and get them read throughout the city of Utrecht. Similar plans are being made for other Dutch cities.

**Rediscovery of Bibles**  
Father Gregory Baum recently announced from Edmonton that an important result of the "dialogues" between Roman Catholics and Protestants in Canada has been a rediscovery of the Bible by Catholics. Father Baum was a consultant to the secretariat for promoting Christian unity. He is a Jewish-born Canadian converted to the Roman Catholic faith.
