laid to rest beside his parents in Omagh Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

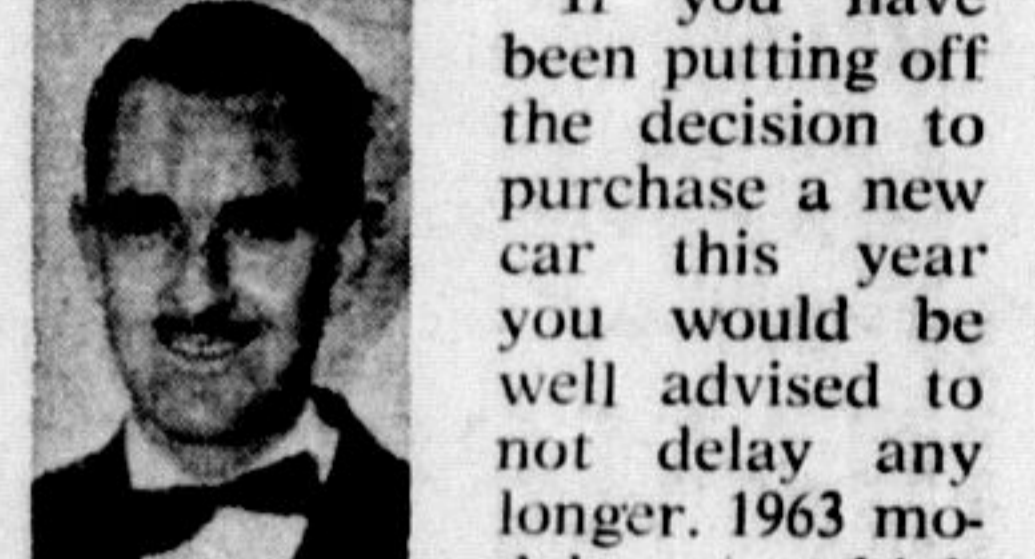
Back to Germany
