Inquiry Blames Failure to Stop In Fatal Crash

A Brampton man's failure to obey a stop sign caused his own death, a coroner's jury ruled Monday, at an inquiry into the death of James Alexander Mc-Hardy, 84, of Brampton. Mr. Mc-Hardy was killed and his wife critically injured in a car-truck collision at Drumquin intersection on July 30.

Testimony at the hearing showed the County of Halton is taking steps to improve a dangerous condition at the intersection, Seventh Line and Five Sideroad, Oakville, by levelling a hill and erecting larger stop signs. Residents of the area demanded a flashing blinker light following the crash, and the county engineer said the request is being considered.

The coroner's jury also released the truck driver from any blame, and suggested the Department of Transport review the age limit for driving examinations for elderly persons.






