Inquiry Blames Failure to Stop In Fatal Crash

A Brampton man's failure to obey a stop sign caused his own death, a coroner's jury ruled Monday, at an inquiry into the death of James Alexander McHardy, 34, of Brampton. Mr. McHardy was killed and his wife critically injured in a car-truck collision at Drumquin intersection on July 30.

Testimony at the hearing showed the County of Halton is taking steps to improve a dangerous condition at the intersection, Seventh Line and Five Sideroad, Oakville, by levelling a hill and erecting larger stop signs. Residents of the area demanded a flashing blinker light following the crash, and the county engineer said the request is being considered.

The coroner's jury also released the truck driver from any blame, and suggested the Department of Transport review the age limit for driving examinations for elderly persons.

Milton Council Monday, following a two-hour closed session to review the town's annexation case:

- Agreed to proclaim International Credit Union Day, at the request of the Holy Rosary Parish Credit Union. The Parish Credit Union noted they had 670 members in Milton.
- Authorized preparation of a construction by-law for the installation of a six inch water main on King St.

- Approved payment of \$1500 of the Recreation Committee 1963 levy to the group.

- Approved the proclamation of Fire Prevention Week.

- Asked the Planning Board to study land use of the areas included in the proposed annexation boundaries.

- Agreed to remove four dead elm trees in front of the J. M. Denves School.

- Granted permission to the Ontario School for the Deaf to trim trees on town property in front of their property.

- Approved installation of a culvert across Ontario St. from the corner of Wakefield Rd. at an angle, rather than straight as detailed by the engineer.

Open New Gates

Received an invitation to the official opening of the new gates at the entrance to the Halton Agricultural Grounds.

Approved payment of the following accounts: Waterworks, \$963.89, parks and welfare \$690.58, light and police \$3184.23, industrial development \$2191.52, sewers and sanitation \$552.26, streets and walks \$1575.18, finance \$10,214.19. It was reported town expenditures in connection with the steam show totalled \$452.26.
