(Continued from page 1) marketing and merchandising division of Cities Service Oil Company at Bronte, and resides in Bronte.

The oldest of the three candidates at 42, he served in the Second World War and the Korean campaign. In the war he was with the Ontario tank regiment, and later joined the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers for the Korean conflict. Between these tours overseas he was a policeman in Niagara Falls, his home town.

He moved to Toronto to work with Cities Service, and was later transferred to Bronte. He joined the New Democratic Party at its founding, and worked hard for the party during the last two elections as a member of the Halton executive. He has served as secretary-treasurer of local 5953, Oil Chemical and Atomic Workers CLC for two years, as well as the past two years as secretary of the Oakville and District Labor Council.

He and his wife Mildred and one daughter Bonnie, 7, live at 577 Valley Drive, Bronte.

**GEORGE A. KERR**

A native of the Gaspé Coast near the New Brunswick border, P.C. candidate George Kerr got his education at Saint John, N.B., and entered University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, for a pre-law course. He graduated from Dalhousie University, Halifax, as a lawyer in 1953.

His wife Merrydith is also a lawyer, and went through law school with him. They live at 3014 Balmoral Ave., Burlington, with their three children, Larry, Margot and Jamie, aged 9, 6, and 3.

He moved to Hamilton in 1954 to article in law, and was admitted to the Ontario bar in 1955. In 1958 he opened his own practice in Burlington.

In 1956 he ran for a position on Burlington council, which he won, and was again successful the next year. Both years he was chairman of the finance committee. He went back into municipal politics in 1961 and won a two-year council term. He has also served with the Recreation Committee, Kinsmen Club, and Retarded Children's Association in Burlington. He served three years on Knox Presbyterian Church Board of Management, and is interested in sports. He is 39. For several years he has been an executive member of Halton Progressive Conservative association.

**OWEN F. MULLIN**

Liberal candidate for the county, Owen Mullin is a native of St. Peters, Prince Edward Island. Educated at St. Dunstan's University at Charlottetown, he graduated as a chemical engineer in 1949, the youngest engineering graduate in the school's history. He is now 34.

That same year he moved to Hamilton and took a position with Dominion Foundries, and

later the Steel Company of Canada. In 1952 he joined Ford of Canada at Windsor and in 1953, was transferred to the new Oakville Ford plant. He is still employed at Ford, now in sales management.

Entering the municipal politics field in 1959, he was elected to town council and served as a representative of Ward One, including two years as chairman of the Building and Planning committee. In 1961 he defeated four other candidates for the position of Mayor.

Mr. Mullin was an unsuccessful contestant in the 1959 Provincial election, losing by 730 votes to veteran P.C. Stanley Hall of Hornby.

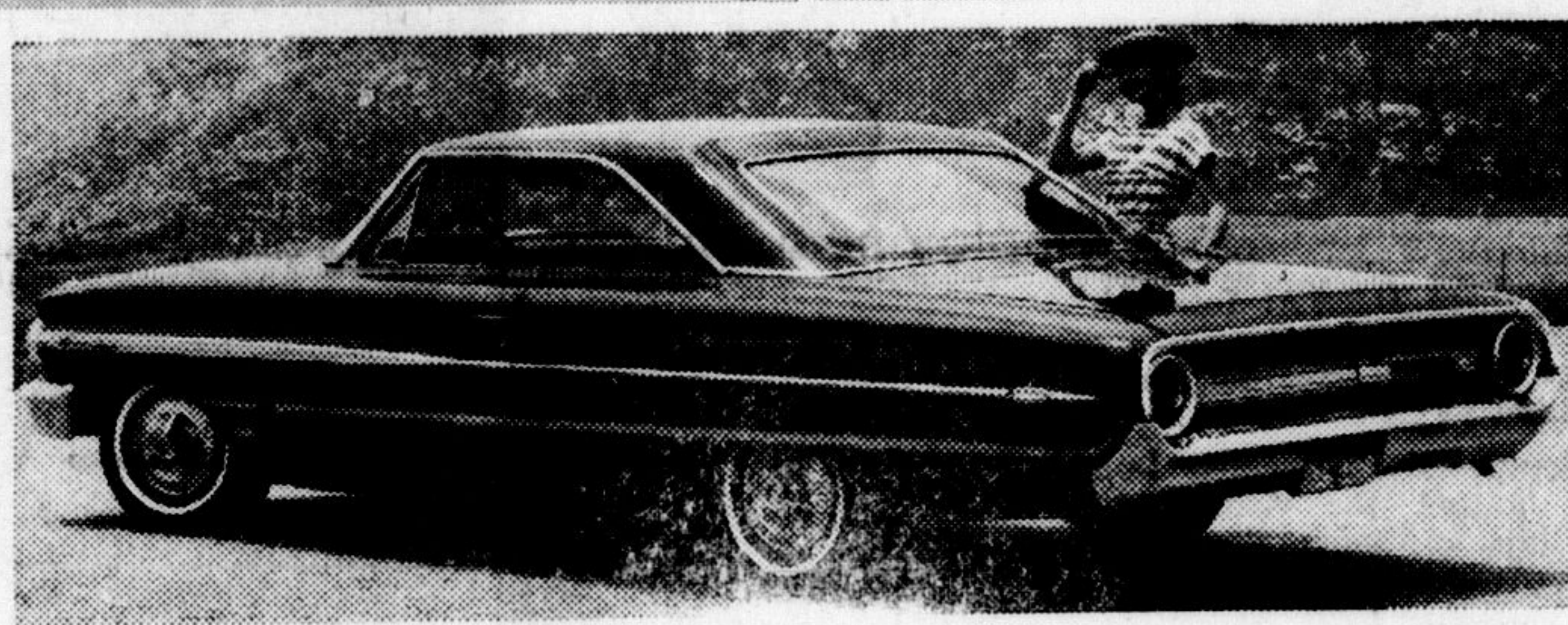

**59,697 Eligible Voters**

Election lists printed and posted throughout Halton's 283 polling subdivisions, show there are 59,697 eligible voters in the county for next Wednesday's provincial election.

Court of Revision sittings were held over the weekend, and it is expected that figure will climb slightly following the addition of any voters who may have been missed by enumerators. Last week, the three candidates officially entered their

names in the election race. Their agents filed official nomination papers with returning officer M. E. Kerr of Oakville, each bearing at least 100 names of qualified voters who act as nominees. Incidentally, if your name is missing from the voters' list and you missed the court of revision, you can still get a vote next Wednesday if you can prove your name appears on the present municipal list of the town or township in which you live.

No meet-the-candidates meetings are scheduled here before the September 25 election, but Halton's three political aspirants faced audiences together on Monday and Tuesday evenings of this week.
