NEW GRAIN STORAGE BINS were recently installed at the Supersweet Formula Feeds Mill in Milton. This is the most recent project in their modernization program. The storage bins are all steel construction, and the grain handling equipment installed in conjunction with these bins embodies the most modern equipment available in this field. These bins have a capacity of approximately 10,000 bushels of grain. In the foreground, the initial stage of excavation work is underway for the next step in Robin Hood's modernization program; a new 60 ton, 60 foot Toledo Truck Scale is to be installed on this area. The scale will be the first scale of its kind in Ontario, with an Autorange Dial and an automatic printer making the scale fully automatic and thereby minimizing the possibility of error.
