Increase Ice Time Milton minor hockey house league players will have an additional hour and a half of ice time each week during the winter season...

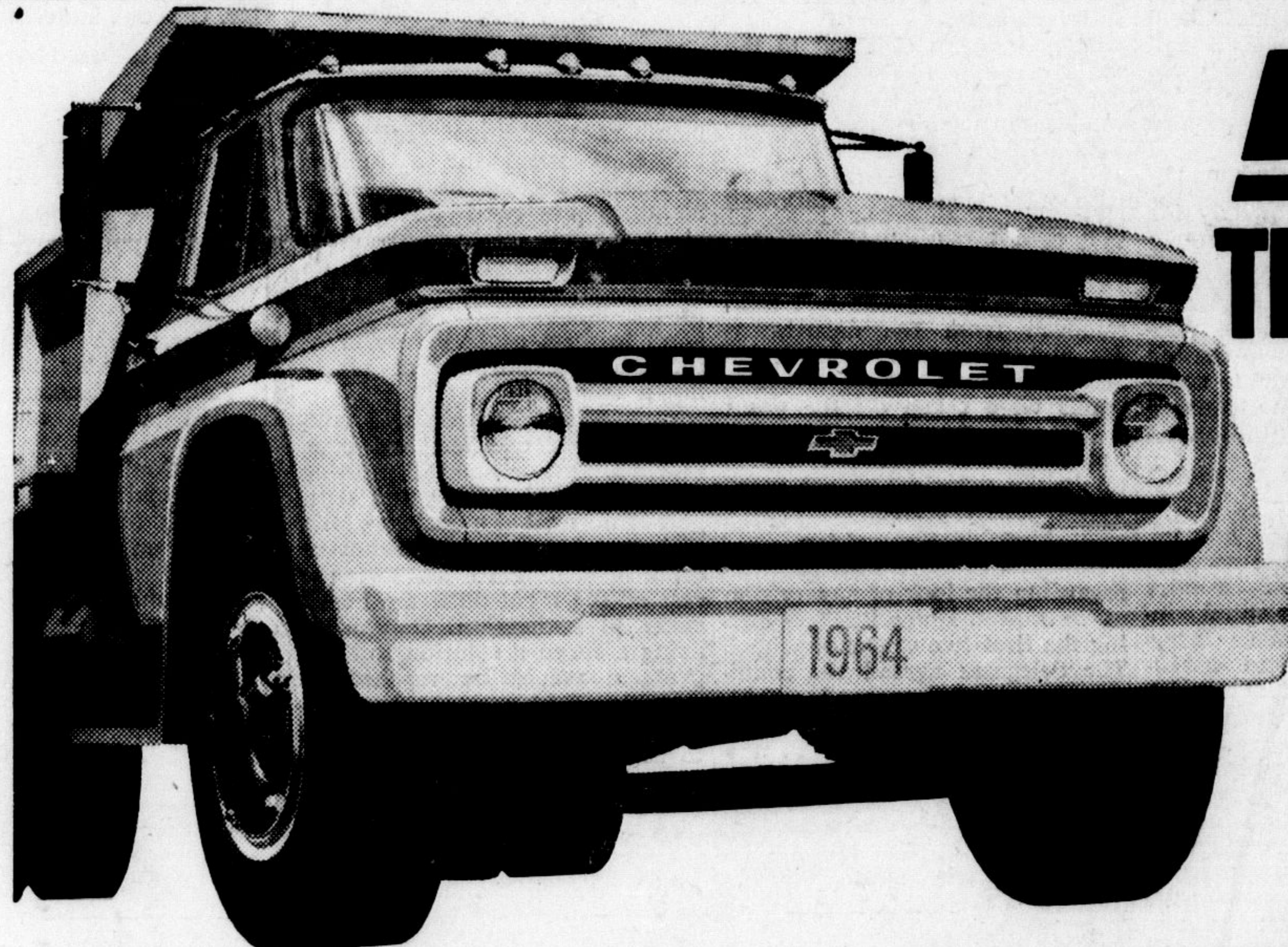
Details Finances Treasurer Ray Andress submitted the association's detailed financial report for 1962-63 which showed a bank balance of \$332.55...
