Investigation among the rapidly growing churches of Latin America showed that inability to use a Concordance, hindered systematic Bible reading. The Bible Societies published an excellent little Concordance in 1960 which was bound together with the Spanish Bible, but it was soon evident that very few people knew how to employ it. As a result a program of education in the use of the Concordance has been introduced.

The basis of this was a pamphlet, itself the outcome of experiments made with representative Bible readers in various parts of Latin America. This teaching pamphlet is for lay personnel who will instruct church groups on the use of the Concordance as a guide to the Bible.

Teach Carefully

On receipt of the draft pamphlet, Bible Society Agencies in Latin America immediately ordered 45,000 copies, including some for Spanish groups in the U.S.A. "If this folder stimulates the beginning of a concern to teach carefully the simple things related to Bible Study, it will serve its purpose" reported Mr. Limkemann, Study Secretary in Latin America.

Concordance are readily available in English, and in only a few other languages. A complete concordance indicates where each word may be found in the Bible. Words are listed alphabetically.

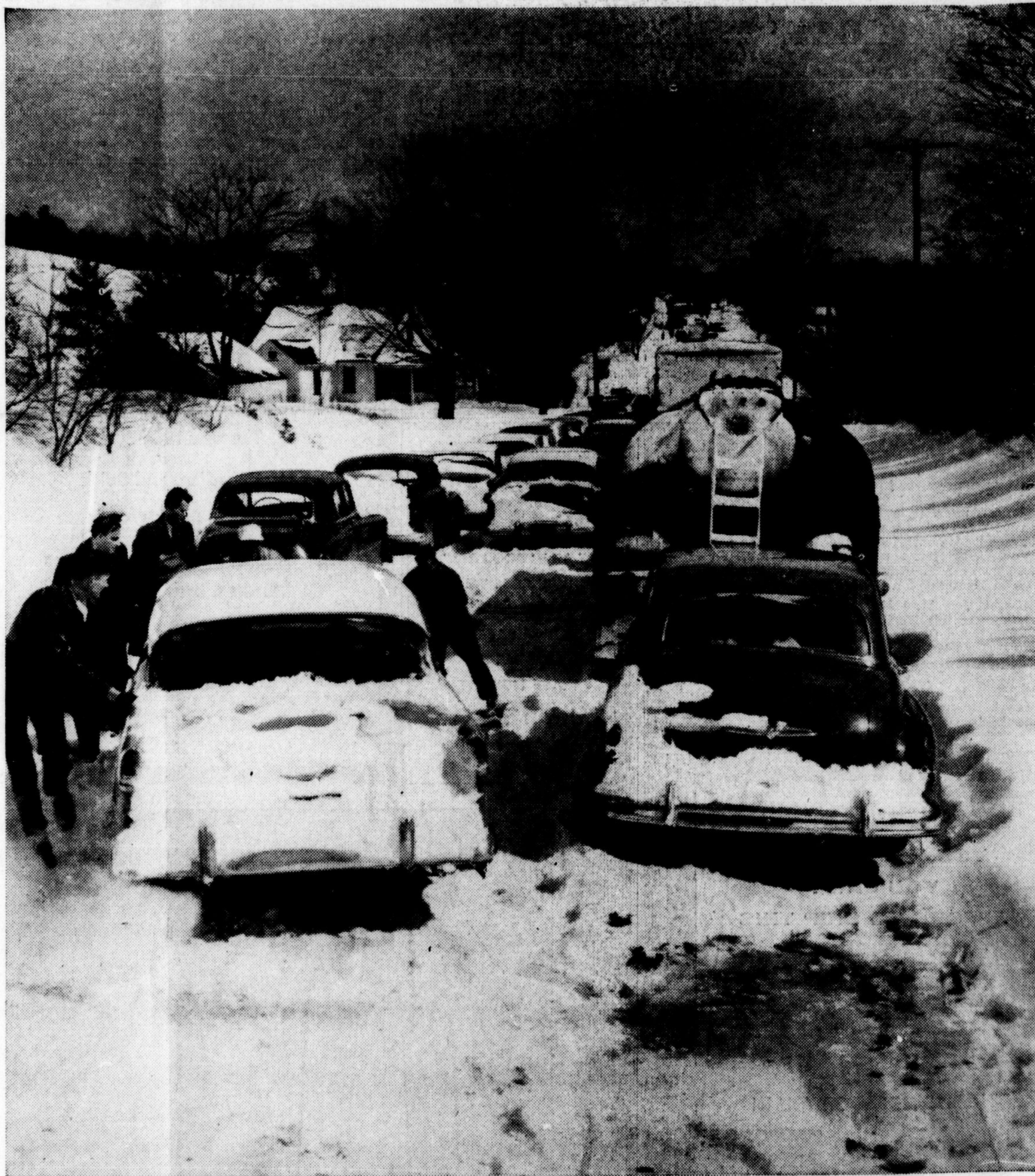

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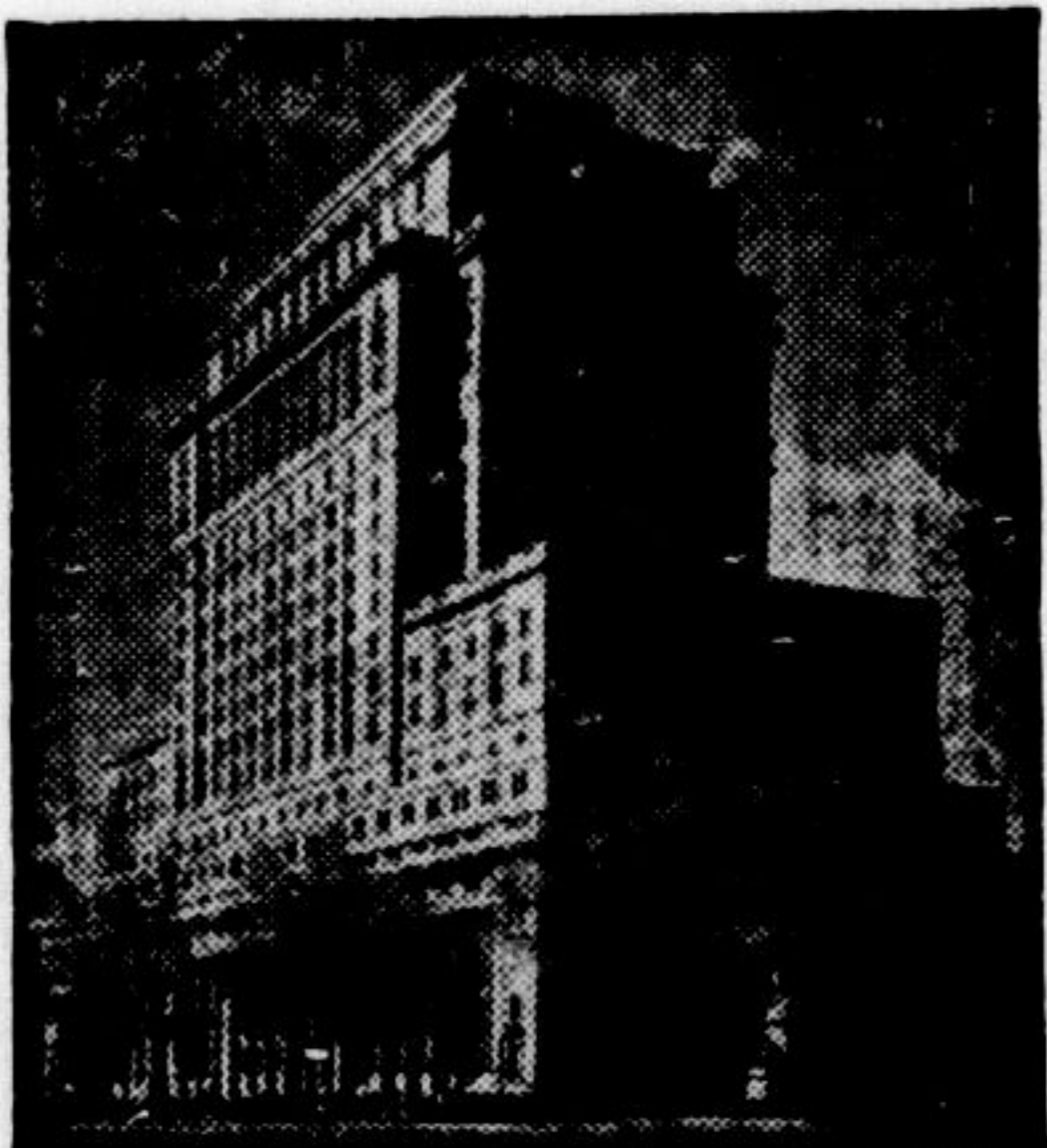
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
