Mrs. Addison will succeed Frank McNiven who recently resigned from the position for health reasons.

In earlier years the chief constable had among his many duties, that of attendance officer. Mr. McNiven took over the work when the Provincial Police were engaged to police the town.

The attendance officer is responsible for the attendance of pupils at school until they are 16, or until they are issued a permit to leave school prior to that time.
