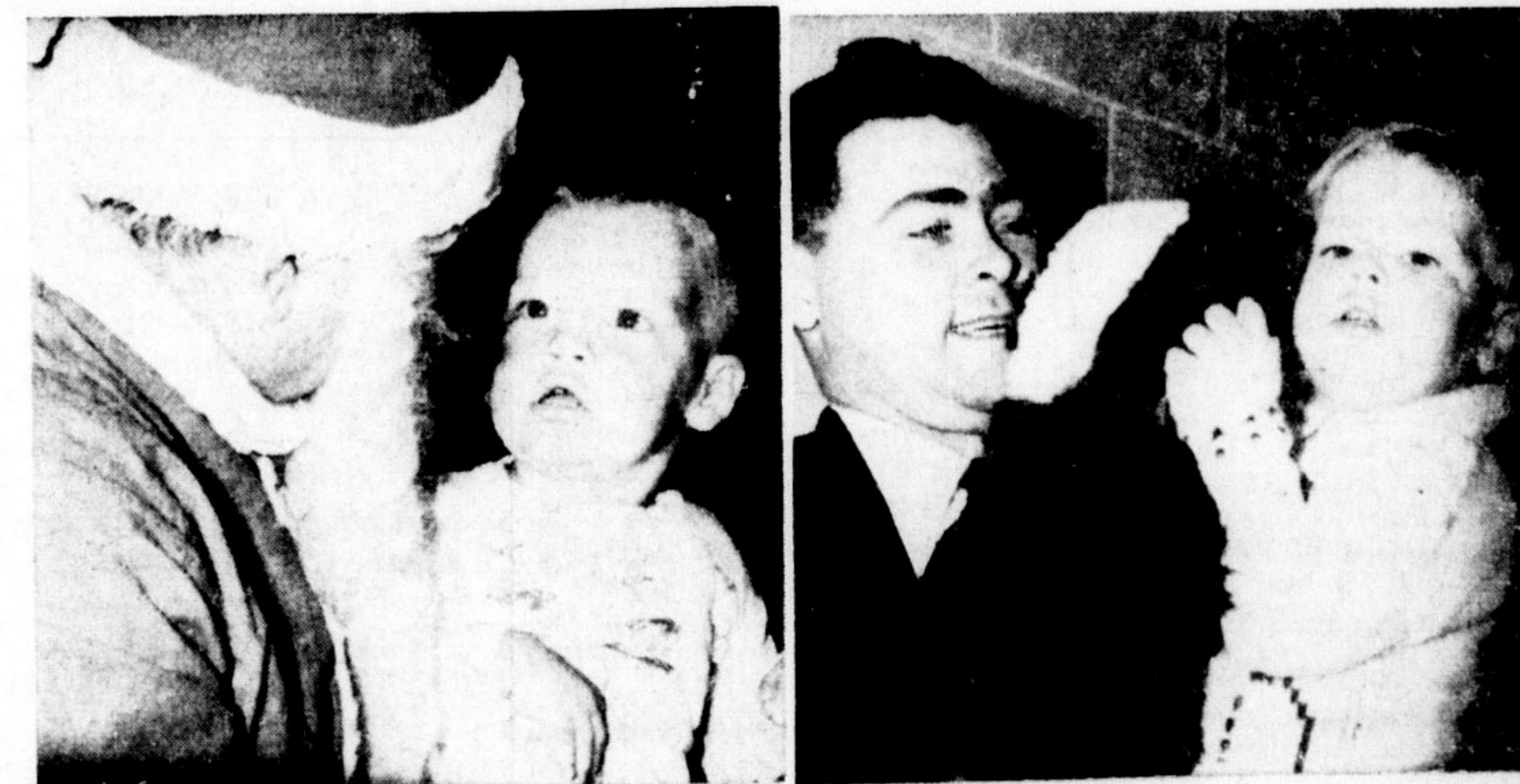

Tests carried out by the Underwriters Laboratories of Canada were outlined by Norm Pearce on Tuesday when he addressed the Rotary Club of Milton.

A movie reviewed the tests carried out on fire equipment before it bears the Underwriters seal of approval. He pointed out this type of work was originated in 1890 when two men began testing sprinkler systems in the United States, and later formed the Underwriters' Laboratories Inc. In 1920 the Canadian organization was incorporated.

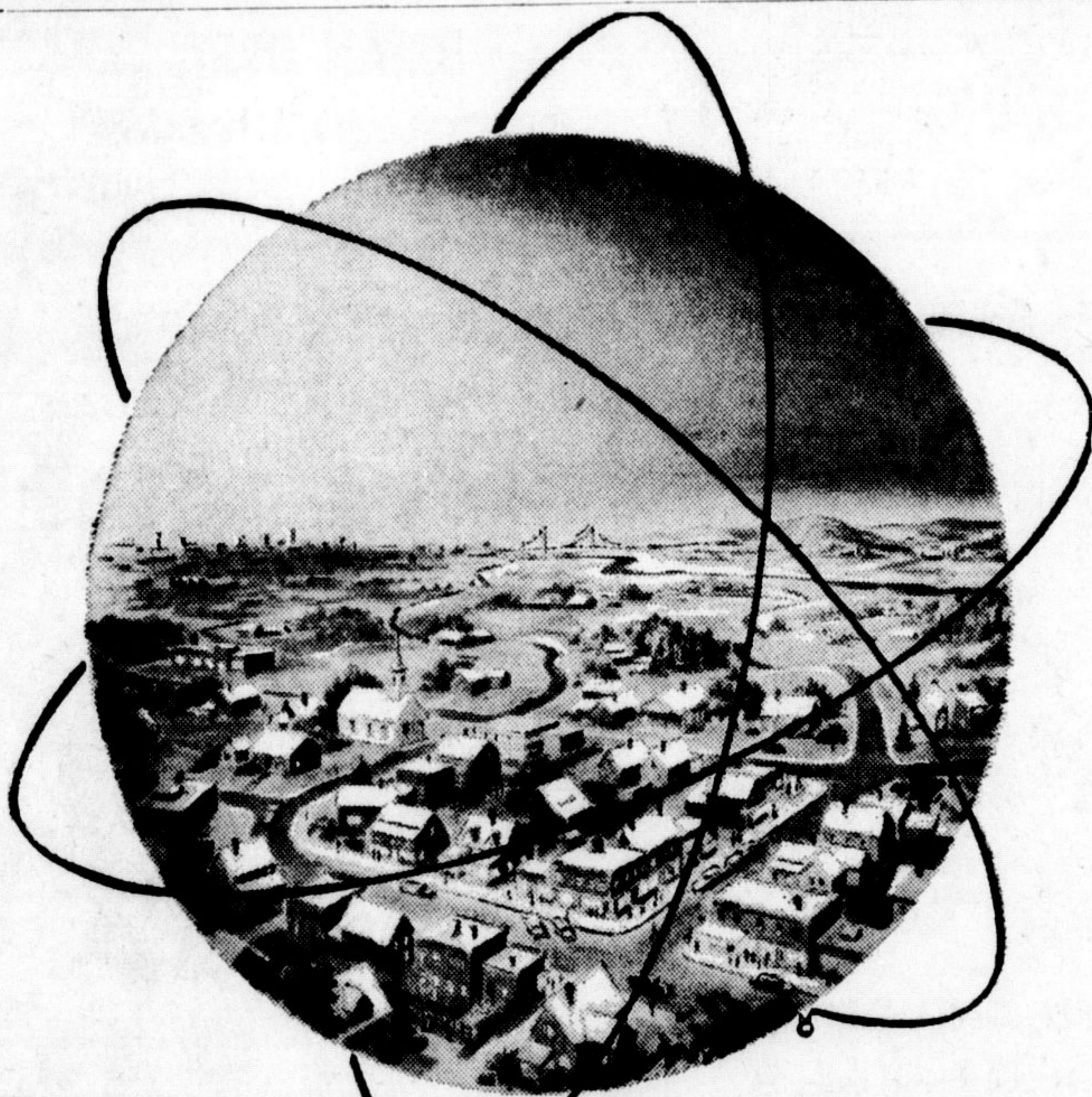
