At a meeting tonight, Halton's Emergency Measures Organization is expected to lay plans for a communications exercise in connection with a car club driving rally in Halton on February 23.

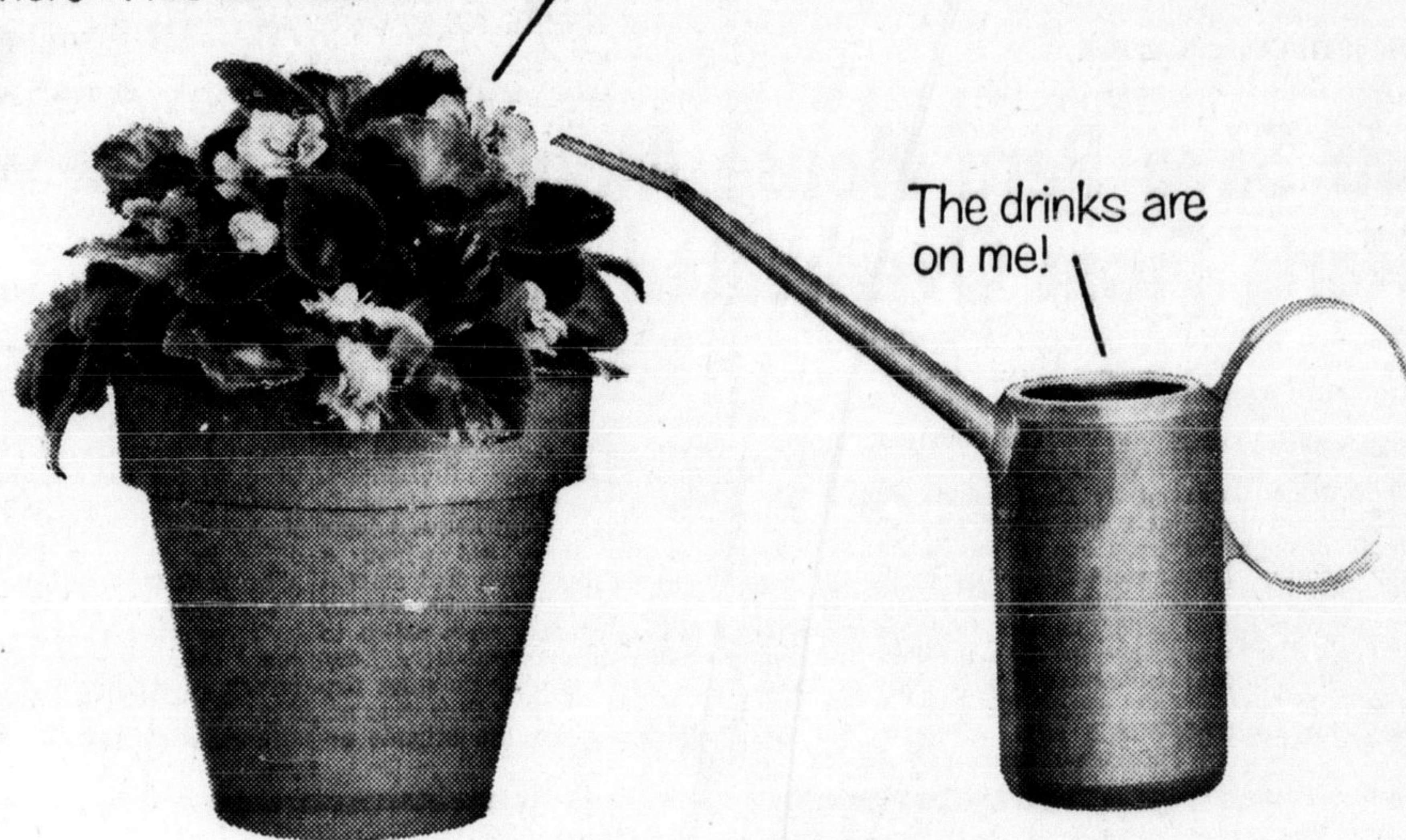
