## Student Council Adopts 10-Year-Old Korean Girl



A 10-year-old Korean girl, financially adopted by Student Council of Milton District High School, is just beginning to receive many of the "ordinary things of life." Yoon Duk Ri, described as gentle, quiet and thoughtful, is now able to have shoes on her feet, a mattress to sleep on and food to eat, thanks to the local student council that agreed to contribute \$16 a month for the child's support for one year at least.

Duk Ri's father was a farmer in Nam Hae, Kyung Sang Namdo for many years, but following the death of his wife, moved his family of three (two sons and Duk Ri) to Seoul, the capital of Korea. Two years ago he developed tuberculosis and now is unable to provide for his family.

Thanks to the Foster Parents Plan and the generosity of the Milton District High School Student Council, Duk Ri will now be able to receive many of the necessities of life and an education. Through the plan she is assured of a monthly cash grant of \$8, clothing, special medical care and an education.
