#### Prominent Banker Dies in Springfield

Bernard A. Colby, 66, retired executive vice-president of the Federal Intermediate Credit bank of Springfield, Massachusetts, died in Springfield Hospital Sunday, April 26.

He began his career in banking with the Spenceport N.Y. bank in 1919. He was a pioneer in developing many new techniques for the extension of credit to farmers in the Northeastern States. His experience with the bank in agricultural credit resulted in his being called to Springfield as assistant treasurer of the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank in 1932. He retired in 1963.

He leaves his wife, Gladys Williamson Colby, who was a former resident of the Drumquin community and sister of Maurice Williamson, 8th Line, a daughter, Miss Jean Colby of Hartford, Conn., and a son Donald of Del Ray Beach, Florida.

Funeral services were held in Springfield on Wednesday, April 29.

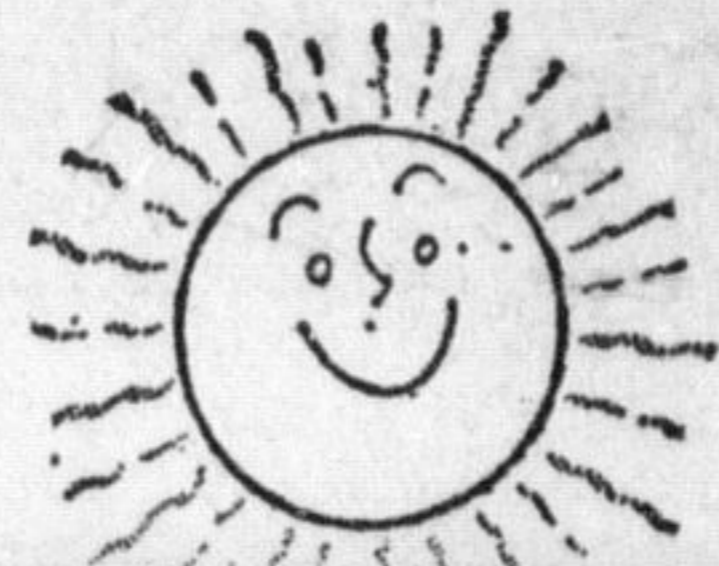
