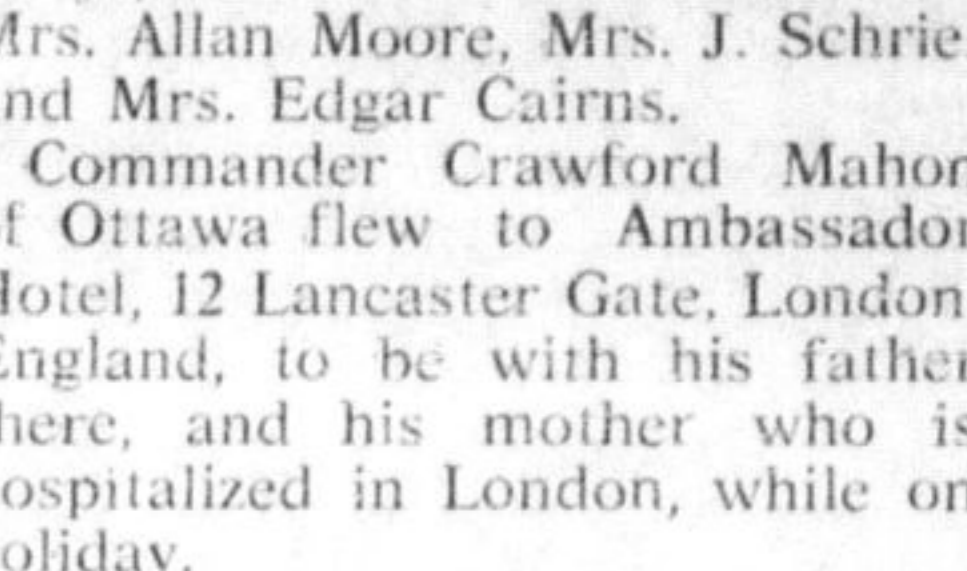
Women's Missionary Meeting
