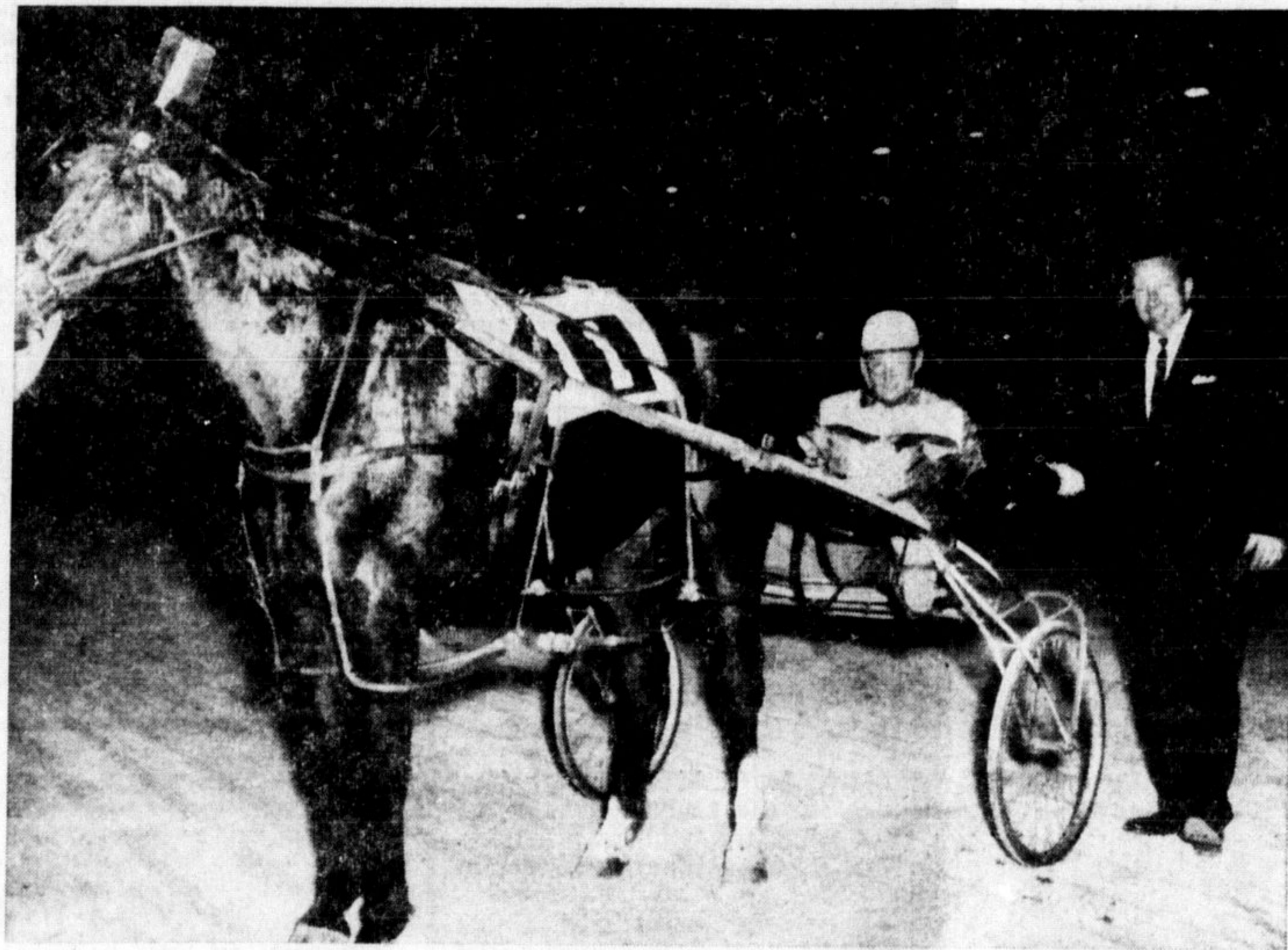

### SAFETY LESSONS FROM A CAB DRIVER

Haskell Shultz owns a cab company in Toronto, that has the lowest ratio of accidents to miles driven of any taxi firm due to three simple rules that anyone can learn and use immediately. If more drivers used them there would be less work for the hospitals and body shops.

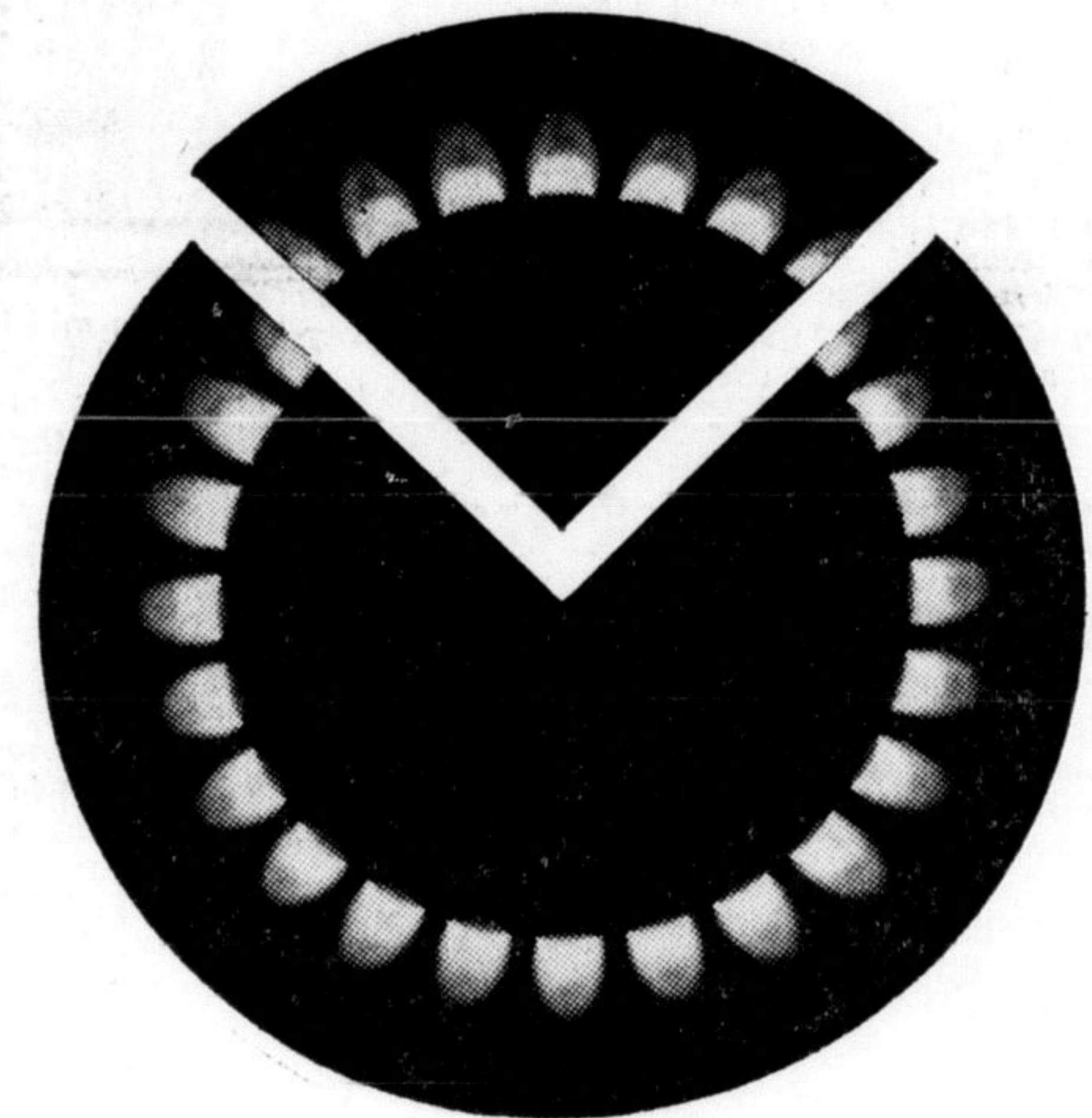
Eight-five percent of city accidents take place at intersections and that's where Mr. Shultz's rules are mostly applied. Here they are: (1) Fifty feet from an uncontrolled intersection take your right foot off the gas pedal and hold it over the brake while you coast through the bisecting street; (2) For every 10 M.P.H. stay one car length behind the car in front; and (3) Stop twice at a controlled intersection, once for pedestrians and once at the curb line for a clear view of the street.

Mr. Shultz believes that people can remember and PRACTICE a few rules and get results where a lot of them would confuse them. He may have something there. He has one additional advice for the highway, check the REAR carefully before slowing down, changing lanes or pulling out from a parked position.
