**Hazard Hunt**

When the 4-H members arrive at the farms, they will be divided into teams for a 'hazard hunt' through the host's barn. Later, demonstrations will be given by the agricultural engineer on methods of extinguishing farm fires, and on recognizing farm fire hazards.

The Halton Fire Prevention Council will show a series of

slides on hazards found on farms which are the cause of many fires. These slides have been taken locally and are used all across Ontario for farm safety meetings.

The Halton Farm Safety Council is donating prizes for lucky draws and is also providing lunch for everyone present.

Since this is a meeting which concerns both 4-H members and their parents, the 4-H members have been asked to invite their parents to attend.
