on-encampment and was built by the Midland Y's Men under the supervision of Dr. Wilfrid Jury, one of Canada's leading archaeologists.

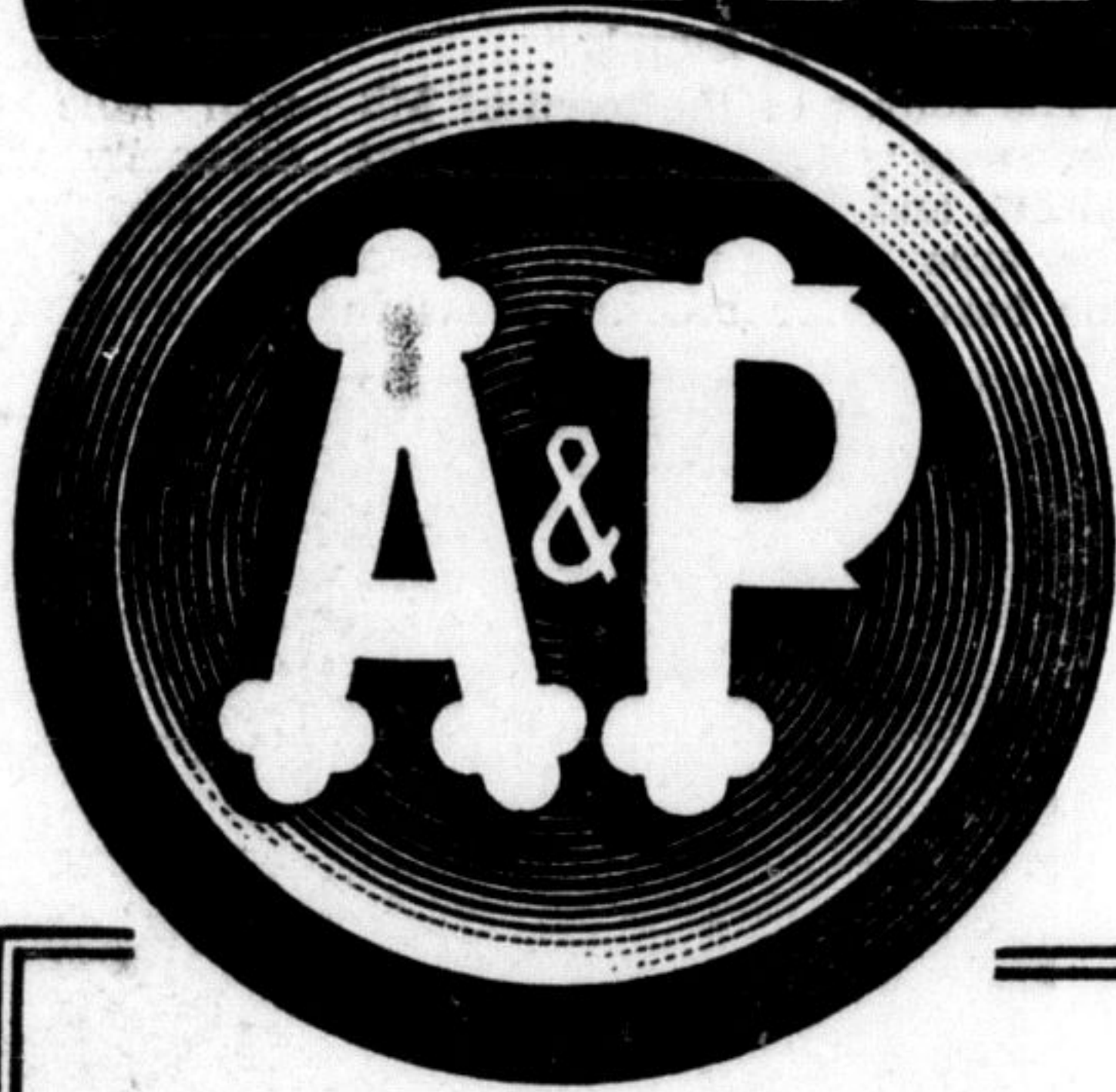
A very pretty guide conducted us through the village explaining
