

J. M. Ledwith Assumes Duties As Rotary District Governor

In the steaming heat of Tuesday evening, Mike Ledwith was officially inducted as the District Governor of Rotary International and Carl Hiltz as president of the Rotary Club of Milton.

District Governor Fred Root, who was concluding his year as senior official in one of the international organization's largest districts — 56 clubs — pinned the diamond lapel button on Mike Ledwith, who will serve from July 1, 1964 to June 30, 1965.

Satisfaction

"There's a lot of work and a lot of satisfaction in the District Governor's job," the retiring governor said. "You're embarking on a great adventure and I wish you the greatest happiness and success in the work," he told the incoming governor.

Accepting the office, Mike noted it was a great responsibility but he felt assured of the backing of the local club. "I will do my best to fulfill the obligations and I hope that in my travels, Milton will be proud of my efforts."

Retiring president of the Milton club, Glyn Roberts expressed his thanks for the honor of serving in that office. He praised the work of past president Bob McCuaig for his work on the park committee and for his support during the past year.
