\$10,000 Grant For Flood Study

George Kerr, M.P.P. for Halton, today announced that the Department of Energy and Resources Management has approved a Provincial Grant in the amount of \$10,000 to the Halton Region Conservation Authority for a flood control engineering survey in the Town of Burlington. This survey is now being carried out by James F. McLaren Company Limited, the Town's Consultants, including a water conservation study and drainage study, particularly in respect to storm drainage conditions in Burlington.

Mr. Kerr also announced that the Provincial Department of Labour has approved assistance to the Burlington Minor Lacrosse Association in their sports program, and arrangements have been made to ship lacrosse sticks and goal sticks to the Association to assist the new Lacrosse League which has recently been set up.
