Unemployment figures for June 1964 decreased some four per cent over the previous year, while the number of persons placed in jobs increased some 14 per cent according to reports received from Miss E. L. Hartwell, manager of the Oakville office of the National Employment Serv-

Despite the close proximity of vacation shut-downs, the need for skilled workers has been high and is still a pressing problem. Die setters, auto and truck mechanics, stationary engineers and machinists are occupations where demand exceeds supply.

Secretaries, waitresses and domestics continue to be in short supply, but temporary lay-offs are helping to ease the situation.

In June, temporary jobs in berry picking and lawn mowing were mainly filled by high school students, but full-time unskilled work for more mature males was practically non-existant.

Area construction workers are being steadily employed, both union and non-union, and fine weather has been of considerable help in this field.
